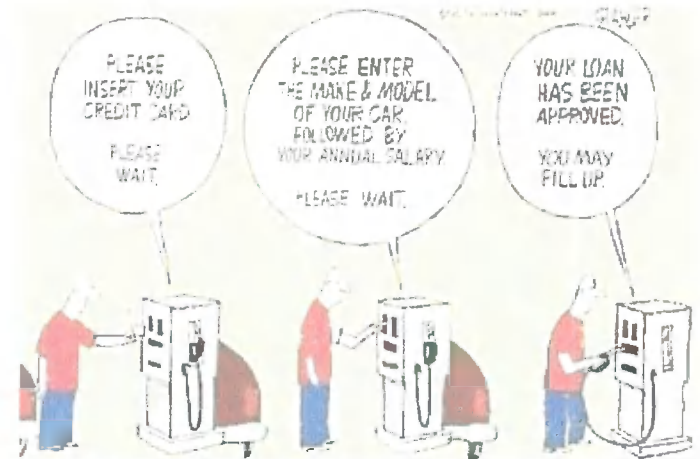


THANKS TO ALL THE VOLUNTEERS

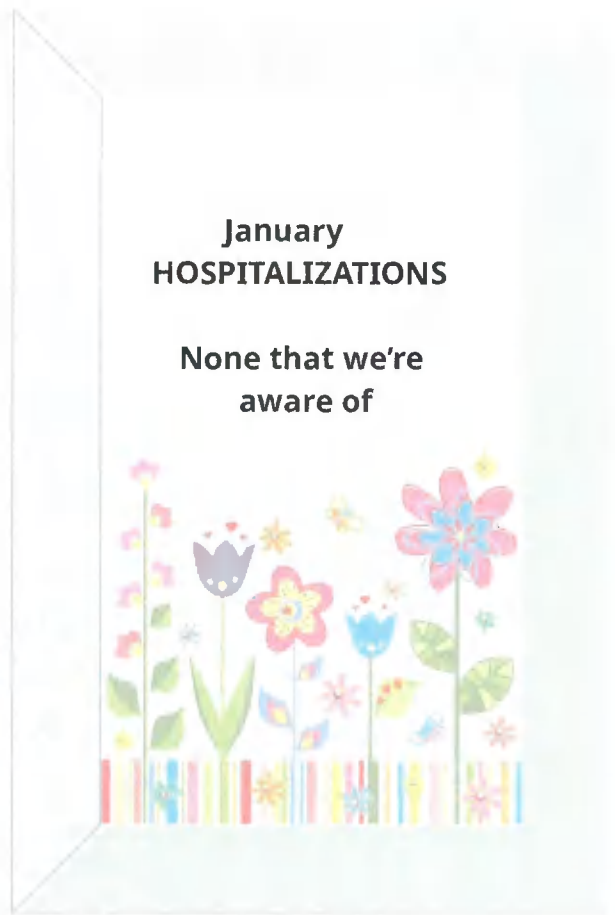

Mahalo, and hope to see you on the 12th!

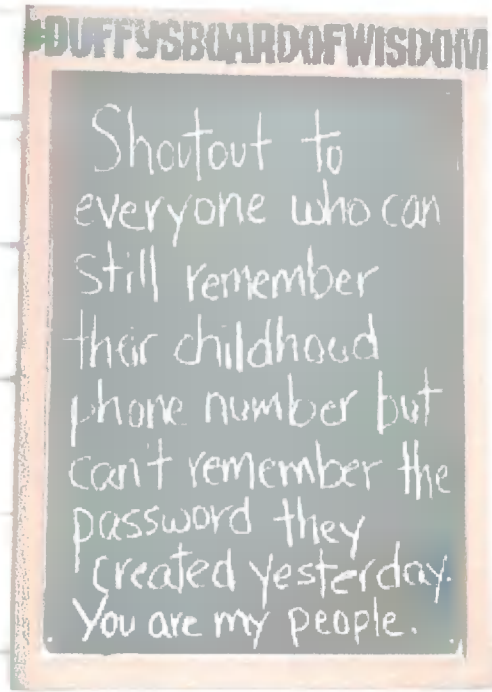

FUN & FOOD

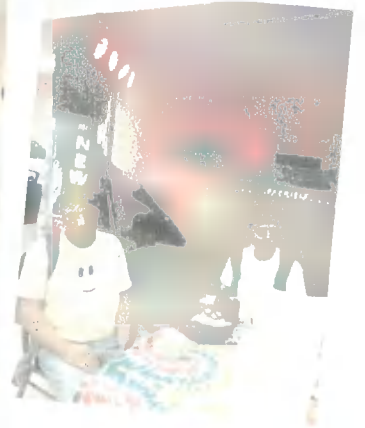

The Colors of January



1 Alyssum

A delicate blanket of tiny flowers with a subtle, sweet scent. This low-growing foliage is covered by flowers for much of the growing season. Full Sun/Part Shade

2 Dianthus

Extra-large, 2" to 2½" blooms dominate the basal branching plants in a blaze of showy color, including an eye-catching mix. Tolerate light freezes. Full Sun/Part Shade

3 Viola

Compact and uniform habit displaying excellent heat tolerance with numerous blooms on each plant. Resistant to hard freeze. Full Sun/Part Shade

4 Pansy

The cold weather plant of choice for late fall, winter, and early spring color. Exceptionally hardy and will thrive in the winter. Resistant to hard freeze. Full Sun/Part Shade

5 Kale

Kale is valued for the bright colors that they bring to the landscape in late autumn and early winter. The wide leaves, arranged in rosette form, are available in various shades. Full Sun/Part Shade

6 Phlox

A cool season plant, perfect for landscapes and mixed containers. Full Sun

7 Dusty Miller

Finely cut silvery/white foliage on a dwarf plant. One of the garden's most attractive foliage plants. Full Sun/Part Shade

8 Snapdragon

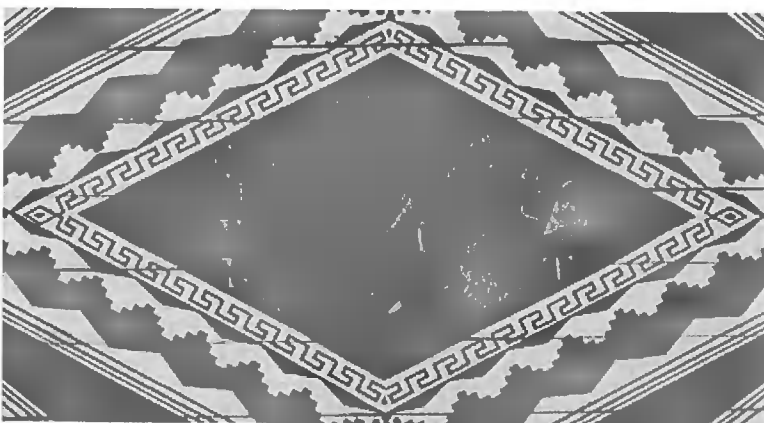
Bushy and compact plants have closely spaced, full flower spikes in a full range of colors. Strong garden performance. Tolerate light freezes. Full Sun/Part Shade

9 Petunia

Delivers large blooms and an even plant growing habit among all colors. Tolerate light freezes. Full Sun/Part Shade

Janus : New Beginnings

January was named for the Roman god Janus, the protector of gates and doorways that symbolize beginnings and endings. Janus is depicted with two faces, one looking into the past, the other with the ability to see into the future. What a fitting symbol for this first day of the year; this month is our door into the new year.



Florida Winter Maintenance

Cold events typically last one to a few days in an average year. January and February are usually the chilliest months.



We go from a "humid subtropical" climate to a cool, dry winter. While the weather is more pleasant, landscapes still require turf fertility and pest management throughout the cool season. It's a great time for installing or transplanting trees and woody ornamental shrubs because the weather is less stressful on the trees and shrubs, and root growth is enhanced.

But the dynamic changes in the January weather require expertise in keeping the proper balance of nutrients and water for your grass. Even though your grass growth has slowed down, it still needs proper irrigation. Rain is less frequent, so irrigation adjustments may be in order. Soggy, heavy leaves that are left on

your property likely won't break down and provide the nutrients your lawn needs. Instead, they'll suffocate your grass during the winter. If you let layer after layer of smothering leaves live on your lawn, you'll likely invite in all of the diseases and pests you've been trying to stay away from during all the other seasons.

Florida's warm-season grasses, primarily St. Augustine, do not go into an actual dormant state. Leaf production is reduced to a point where mowing is only required every two weeks. The primary turf problems dealt with in the winter are Brown Patch and perennial and winter annual broadleaf weeds.

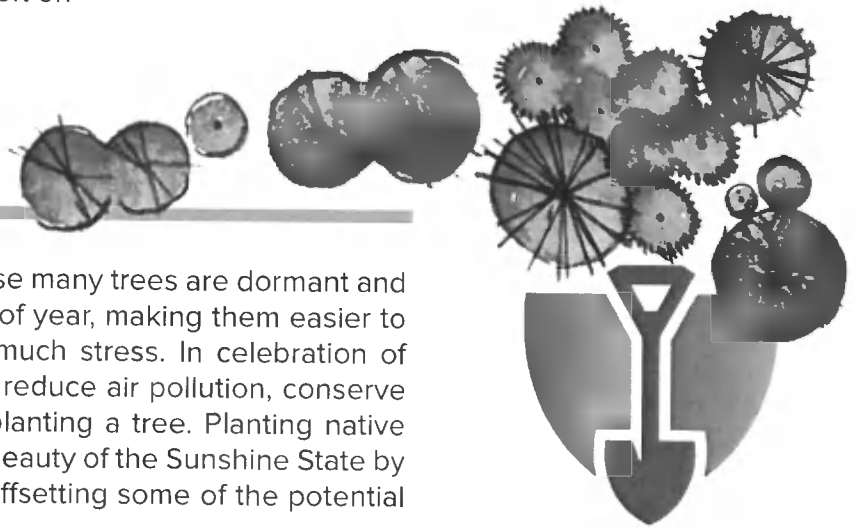
Unfortunately, pest problems are always with us. If our winter stays warmer than usual, we will be on the lookout for insects such as chinch bugs, sod webworms, and other lawn caterpillars, as well as scales, spider mites, aphids, and thrips, who continue to cause damage throughout the winter.

We are not hibernating and continue to work hard to create and care for beautiful landscapes that increase property values and enhance our environment.

Florida Arbor Day

Sunday, January 21st New Moon

Florida celebrates Arbor Day in January because many trees are dormant and lose less water through transpiration this time of year, making them easier to transplant without putting them through too much stress. In celebration of Florida's Arbor Day, do your part in helping to reduce air pollution, conserve energy, and beautify the State of Florida by planting a tree. Planting native trees protects the environmental balance and beauty of the Sunshine State by preventing the spread of invasive plants and offsetting some of the potential impacts of climate change.



The Full Wolf Moon

On Monday, January 17th, January's Full Moon (called the Wolf Moon) reaches peak illumination at 6:51 PM EST, and it can be seen rising from the horizon around sunset that evening.
