**Manager's Reminders**



Second only to the many resident stop-ins to say Hi and welcome me this past month, were the number of visits, calls and emails expressing concern about vehicles PARKING ON SIDEWALKS in the Park. So, I'm picking up with the reminder that **vehicles should not be parked on the sidewalk**, and

adding some food for thought...

Vehicles PARKED ON OUR SIDEWALKS present an obstacle to residents that are then forced to walk around them into the street. Easy if you're able-bodied; not so for others, or if you use an assistive device (wheelchair, etc.). Putting neighbors at risk is not intentional, but that's the result. When I think of it this way, parking on the sidewalk suddenly becomes dangerous. Visitors and contractors may think they're doing the right thing by parking on the sidewalk so as not to crowd the narrow streets. But, you can help by simply telling them to park in the street and NOT on the sidewalk. Be attentive to where your guests park and ask them to move if needed.

**To quote that wise park manager Tony T: It's not everyone, but everyone can help.**

**Parking Around the Clubhouse**

- When parked overnight at the Clubhouse, vehicles must bear identification (the owner's lot number). Place Unit # on dashboard so that it's visible from outside the vehicle. This applies to all vehicles, owners and their guests.

**Golf Cart Safety**

-Observe Park Stop Signs and Posted Speed.  
-Children should not operate golf carts and should be supervised by adults when they are passengers.

-Golf carts are not permitted to be driven on yards or the Park common area, nor parked on sidewalks.



**Please Remember, Dogs Must Be ALWAYS LEASHED ... this is an SRI rule as well as a PINELLAS COUNTY ORDINANCE, Sec. 14-63(a):**

*No dog or cat shall run at-large within the county, as defined under this article. Any person who possesses, harbors, keeps, or has control or custody of any dog or cat which is running at-large shall be in violation of this article, regardless of the knowledge, or culpability of the owner.*

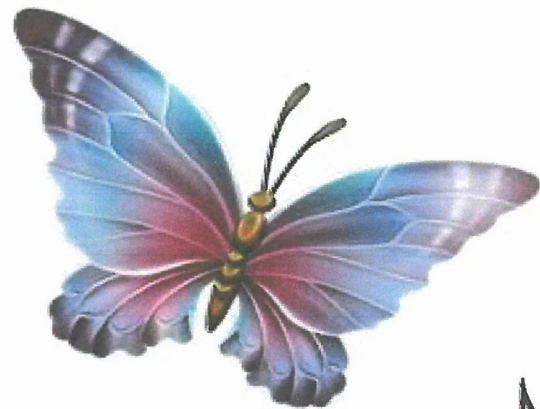



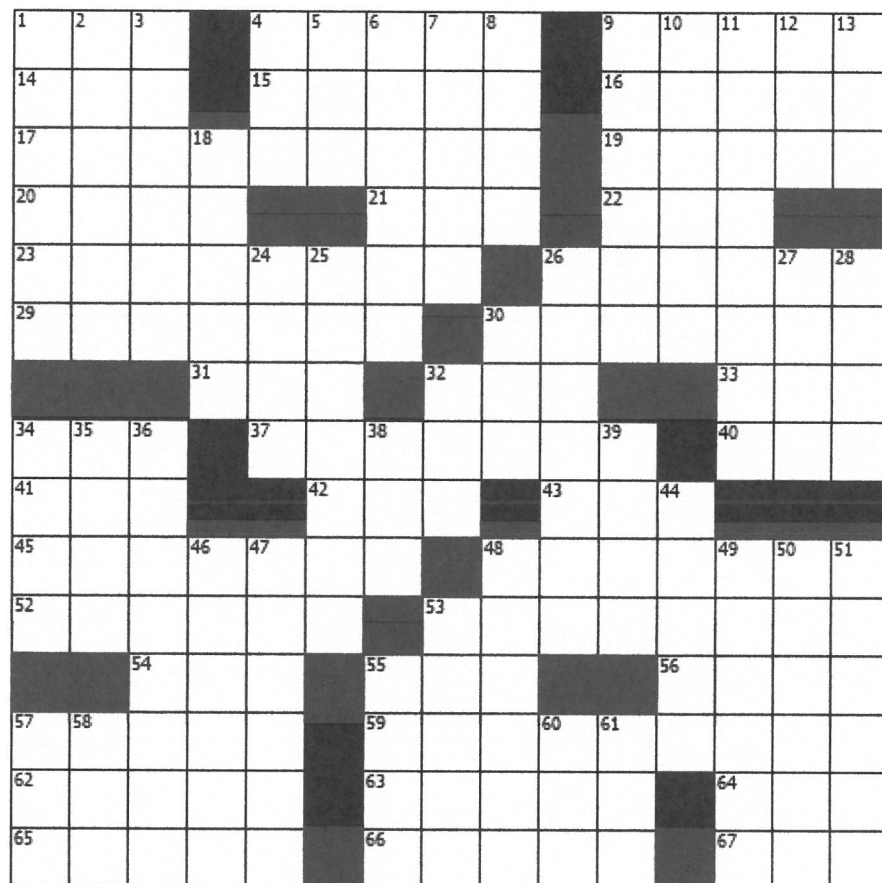
