

#### **NOVEMBER 2023**

November is here and with it the park is coming to life with the excitement of returning residents, activities, and pre-holiday preparations! On the Office side, things are equally busy with Budget presentation, meetings, and year - end and year-ahead organization. So don't forget to mark your calendars for the NOVEMBER 15<sup>th</sup> Budget Adoption Meeting & November Board Meeting, 9:00 am at the Clubhouse.

Speaking of the budget, a copy of the PROPOSED 2024 BUDGET was mailed to residents on October 12 along with notice of the November 15<sup>th</sup> Budget Adoption Meeting. If you have not received this, please contact the Office for copies of the mailing.

The proposed budget reflects an increase of \$24 per month per unit for next year's maintenance fee. This will be reviewed in detail at the November 15<sup>th</sup> meeting. But in the meantime, I wanted to provide a breakdown of the proposed increase to give context and basis for the current proposal.

### The proposed \$24 per month increase includes:

- \$10.50 per unit/mo. for increases in combined <u>UTILITIES & CABLE/INTERNET</u>-Lines 7000-7006
- \$2.83 for <u>RESERVES</u> per unit/mo. to meet CURRENT replacement quotes
- \$3.14 for INSURANCE per unit/mo. Line 5300
- \$0.79 per unit/mo. to Line 5440 to provide \$2500 for PARK PALM TREES.
- \$1.04 per unit/mo. for Salary/Office Line 6400
- \$1.76 per unit/mo. for Salaries/Maintenance Line 6410
- \$3.94 per unit/mo. to fund necessary increases in remaining line items

## The \$2.83 increase for Reserves Funding will translate to an <u>additional</u> \$9000 contribution to reserves. This will allow:

-adequate funding by the end of 2024 for the boardapproved POOL RESURFACE project

 -an increased monthly contribution to Roof reserve to reflect current quotes for Roof replacement
 -an increase in the monthly contributions to Irrigation/Wells reserve to reflect current quoted costs

Maintaining reserves that keep pace with actual replacement costs is necessary and a Reserve Study update in 2024 will ensure continued accurate reserve planning and funding.

### STONEHEDGE MANDATORY AGE CENSUS

In the budget mailing you also received a 2023 CENSUS FORM for completion and return to the Office no later than 12/31/2023. Please give this form your immediate attention. SRI must have this form on file for all 265 units to follow HUD requirements to maintain our designation as a 55-year-old and over community. For your convenience a 2023 CENSUS FORM is included in this issue. Thank you for returning your completed form promptly.

### **POOL RESURFACE UPDATE**

The project is slated for January 2025 start. It is estimated to take 4-5 weeks and will include cleaning and resealing of the patio deck pavers.

#### ABOUT STREET PARKING

There is not an SRI rule that prohibits parallel street parking in the park.

That said, if you do parallel park on our streets, your help is needed to address a few practical and SAFETY issues:

(Manager's Korner - continued)

### -Park a SAFE DISTANCE AWAY from Intersections

- -Avoid parking in a spot that could make it difficult for neighbors to enter or exit their carport.
- -Park as CLOSE TO THE SIDEWALK as possible, but please, NOT on IT.
- -Please continue to remind visitors and contractors to park in the Street and NOT ON THE SIDEWALK.

#### **THIS & THAT**

- -REMINDER ABOUT RV/CAMPER PARKING AT THE CLUBHOUSE: Please remember that CONNECTING TO ELECTRICAL in the area is <u>PROHIBITED</u>. Parking in this area is LIMITED to 5 days in any 30-day period. Prior arrangement with the Office is recommended.
- **-Dog Walking is NOT PERMITTED on park streets or sidewalks.** The only authorized dog walking area is the two outside strips of common area along the east main entrance up to Cody's Way sidewalk as a limiting point on both sides of the entrance. Remember, according to our rules, parking in the dog-walking area is allowed ONLY on the SOUTH SIDE.
- -VEHICLE ID: place UNIT NUMBER in the window of vehicles parked overnight at the Clubhouse.
- -GUESTS always need to SIGN IN at the INFORMATION CENTER at the Clubhouse. **Be** sure to make your guests aware of park rules, pool hours, and dress code.
- -DUMPSTER DO'S: BREAKDOWN CARDBOARD BOXES; NOTHING OVER 4-FT LONG; DO NOT OVERFILL. Dumpsters are for residents' use only. Contractors must dispose of garbage and construction debris elsewhere.
- **-VISITING DOGS to a Non-dog lot:** as required by our rules, **written Board approval is**

required, and requests must be submitted in writing at least 10 days prior to the visit. Refer to the Pet Section in the Rules and Regulations of Stonehedge (p. 18) for complete information.

### -MANGO STREET CONSTRUCTION

As of this writing, work has started. There is ONLY left turn access from the Azalea Gate to go west. Currently, there is no eastbound access to the Azalea Gate from Mango Street. PLEASE USE CAUTION in this area and at US 19 when using as an alternate.

### -FALL TREE TRIM

Please notify the office of palms that have seed pods, dead fronds, or issues that need to be assessed. Trimming along the south fence line will also be done. Start is tentative for second week of November.





### **2023 CENSUS FORM**

One of the requirements to <u>maintain our exemption as a 55 year of age or older association under the FAIR HOUSING ACT</u> (HR 660, 1995), is for STONEHEDGE RESIDENTS INCORPORATED to conduct an **AGE CENSUS** for park residents and owners of homes. **As such, an in-house Census of Stonehedge Residents is required every two (2) years.** 

The last full status Census was done in 2021. To update our records, a full occupancy Census will need to be taken to record the occupancy for the 2023 year.

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
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
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
