MANGO STREET PROJECT TO START

Here is the latest update from the City of Tarpon:

SRI BOARD MEETING - 9am

The <u>EASTERN half of Mango Street</u> will be CLOSED DOWN starting

EARLY October through FEBRUARY 2024.
The road will be CLOSED TO THROUGH TRAFFIC and OPEN FOR LOCAL TRAFFIC ONLY. _
Stonehedge Residents should expect to have LIMITED ACCESS from North Gate during construction.

ACCESS TO AND FROM US-19 from MANGO STREET will remain CLOSED FOR THE DURATION OF THE CONSTRUCTION.
A RIGHT TURN LANE WILL BE ADDED FROM THE EASTBOUND TRAFFIC LANE to the north Stonehedge entrance.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACCESS DURING CONSTRUCTION will be UN-INTERRUPTED. According to Tarpon Springs Fire Marshall, Richard

Kinny, the Mango Street Entrance has an Emergency Response over-ride switch on the gate and arms, and all is working properly.

**Please remember that during the construction project, NOT USING THE BACK GATE, IF POSSIBLE, will EXPEDITE construction so that it can be COMPLETED AS FAST AS POSSIBLE.

2024 POOL RESURFACE PROJECT APPROVED

At the September meeting the Board approved THE POOL WORKS as the company to do the planned 2024 resurface of the pool. The project will also include new rails and ladders and cleaning and resealing of the entire paver deck. Start is tentative for late 2024 and will be funded by reserves. Stay tuned for more details and dates as they become available.

ROOF COMMMITTEE – Volunteers Needed

In preparation for the anticipated roof replacement in 2026, a Roof Committee is being formed. If you have construction experience or expertise in roofing, please consider volunteering. The Roof Committee would review roof options, quotes, meet with vendors, and ultimately make recommendations to the board. Please contact the Office if interested.

Hi from the North Atlantic!

The ship is now travelling west as we make our way back home, with only two weeks left!

Djupivogur(pronounced Jupigur!), Iceland, a town of only 450 people, is nestled in a fiord of Iceland, skyline dominated by a pyramid shaped mountain. The dependency primarily on a thriving fishing industry is evident in the vessels in the harbour as well as the expanding fish processing plant and the building of a pipeline to take the fish waste to tanks further out of town for disposal rather than dumping into the sea. We were so delighted to walk among the homes and greet the local people in a natural setting with none of the big city tourism hype. The increasing influx of tourists and of vehicles is causing a sidewalk to be built to keep it safer for us.

Reykjavik, the capital city of Iceland, and the surrounding countryside, typifies the expression "A Land Of Ice And Fire". The first day spent here took us to a geothermal power plant, an awesome waterfall, a field of bubbling hot springs and geysers, and a UNESCO World Heritage Site where the first known parliament in the world was held. Only photos can do justice to these sites and the eight hour bus trip! On day two, the Hop On Hop Off bus was our choice for travel, getting off at the majestic modernistic Lutheran church.

The return to Prince Christian Sound, Greenland, was as astounding with its views as it was going west to east earlier in this trip. The Captain was able to get us to within meters of the largest glacier we saw. There were still many icebergs in the water at this mid point of August. The Danish **Pilots** kept safe! Ice QQagortug(Kakortuk pronunciation!) was the northernmost port for this journey. The friendly welcoming people of this town are mostly Inuit, looking very much like the Inuit of Canada. Fishing again dominates the livelihood of these northern people. The fairly large presence of young people working, as well as three or four

large school buildings, would indicate that there is enough to keep them here. The homes and the public buildings are all brightly coloured. Until the 1950's, these colours were used to indicate the purpose of the building or employment of the inhabitant.

Back to Newfoundland, going first to St. Anthony and then to St. Johns. Twenty minutes outside of St. Anthony is the only known settlement of Vikings, in North America, established by Leif Erikson, in the 900's I think. Today, the townspeople rely still on fishing for a living. A well-loved and well-revered figure in Canadian history is Dr. Grenfell. This British physician missionary spent his life dedicated to improving the many aspects of the lives of the people of Newfoundland and Labrador. There are many signs of his memory being honoured in St. Anthony.

St. Johns is the capital of Newfoundland Labrador. Of course, there are government buildings here, both new and old. This province joined Canada in 1949. The several churches are beautiful examples pf the architecture from the periods in which they were built. To truly survive walking around in this city, you have to be part mountain goat. It is a constant up and downhill trek, made even more challenging in the rain. This city's downtown is highlighted by street after street of colourful row housing, mostly of three stories. To really feel at home, we visited the Tim Horton's for apple fritters, coffee, and a coke!

The final port on this memorable voyage was Halifax, Nova Scotia. Having been here a few times, we strolled the wonderful Harbor Boardwalk and then made our way uphill for a LONG way to reach the Public Gardens. The peace and beauty was well worth the climb!

So, farewell for now. We plan to visit you "LIVE" some Wednesday in November at the clubhouse. We will share with you the many sights of Greenland and Iceland at that time! Hope to see you then!





- In accordance with FL Statute 316.305, no texting while operating (driving)

- Clean truck bed as may be needed BEFORE return.
- Time and Use Sheet must be filled out upon completion of use.

Pets shall include dogs, cats, and birds.

Exotic pets or any animal with poisonous bites or injection capability, farm animals and animals with loud or raucous calls **are excluded**.

Dogs are allowed in the pet section only as designated by the Board, i.e., perimeter area (see DEFINITIONS AND ABBREVIATIONS in full set of Rules).

Dogs shall be no more than twenty (20") inches high. <u>The number of pets shall be no more than two</u>, excluding small fish, per residence.

Visiting dog(s) (2 maximum) to a non-dog lot is allowed **ONLY after receiving WRITTEN Board of Directors or Management approval.** The following apply:

- a. Written request must be submitted at least 10 days in advance of visit.
- b. Maximum stay is up to seven (7) days within a 30-day period.
- c. Owner of the dog(s) should be prepared to provide a copy of up-to-date vaccination records.
- d. Compliance with ALL pet restrictions is required.

Cats and dogs in the pet section outside the home must **be under control at all times**, **either on a leash or within an invisible fence system.** The invisible fence must be installed at the owner's expense by an approved company allowing the animals access only to the side and back of the property and as approved by the board.

No pets are allowed in common areas, recreational areas, Clubhouse building, streets (except to cross), or yard of other residents without permission.

Pets must be walked on a leash only on the two outside strips of common area along the east main entrance up to the Cody's way sidewalk, as a limiting point on both sides of the entrance. Cars may be parked on the right (south) side only. The total # of vehicles including golf carts is limited to 4. The areas are off limits before 7:30 AM and after 8:30 PM so as not to disturb homes close to that area.

Residents shall clean up after their pets. Excessive barking or noise will not be tolerated.

All dogs and cats shall be registered with the park at the Manager's office effective March 2007. Residents must submit to the Park Manager or SRI Board written evidence of rabies vaccination of their dog and adequate shots for their cat, on request. Ask your veterinarian for a copy of same.

When a pet dies, it can be replaced (subject to item #1 and #2).

All residents <u>requesting</u> assistance animals residing outside the designated pet sections must fully complete the ASSISTANCE **ANIMAL** REQUEST form. This request must be reviewed by the association's attorney and approved by the Board <u>prior</u> to any assistance animal being allowed on a property outside the **designated pet section**. (Request form from office.)
