

If you are not signed up for the GROUP EMAIL LIST and would like to receive the pdf version of the Telephone Directory, email or call the office. Printed telephone directories will continue to be available at the Stonehedge

But wait ... Why aren't you on the GROUP **EMAIL LIST?**

You can subscribe to Group Emails by EMAILING the office and requesting to be added to the Group Email List or sign-up in person at the Office. Remember, Group Email recipients are "Blind Copied", so your Email address is NOT visible, and it remains private. Only Stonehedge Residents are included in the Group Email List. Join today to receive timely and important community notices and information.

SOMETHING NEW

Monthly finance reports and meeting minutes will now be

distributed to residents through the GROUP EMAIL LIST! For those not receiving Group Emails, these will be available for viewing and downloading on our website, and they will also be posted on clubhouse bulletin boards.

In this way residents will be able to easily access finance reports and minutes and stay informed from meeting to meeting and month to month. This will also pave the way to save time on the reading of finance reports and minutes at each board meeting and instead facilitate their approval by motion to approve the finance report (or minutes) as distributed. Residents are encouraged to read the distributed finance reports and minutes prior to each meeting.

CAUTION at the Pet Walking Area

Drivers, when exiting or entering the community, be alert for golf carts or cars parked on the RIGHT SIDE of the road along the Pet Walking Areas. Especially in the early morning and evening hours, be attentive and STAY TO THE LEFT to avoid parked vehicles. SLOW DOWN and maintain our 15 MPH speed limit in this area as well.

Dog Walkers, park on the Right Side of the road and use your vehicle's hazard lights when stopped at the Pet Walking Area. For golf carts, consider using portable LED safety lights designed for bikes and runners. These can be clipped to soft surfaces or secured with included hook & loop (Velcro) straps to handles, metal bars, etc. LED safety lights are available at Walmart (iCLOVER 3-pack, \$10 - batteries included) and Amazon (BLITZU 4 pack, \$14.99 – batteries included).

Do I OWN my Lot?

This is a frequent question from potential buyers and new residents in Stonehedge. Read on ... the answer may ... or may not ... surprise you!

As a shareholder in a COOPERATIVE - or Resident Owned Community - the answer is NO. In Stonehedge, residents (Shareholders) do not own the specific piece of ground their unit sits on. Rather, ALL THE SHAREHOLDERS OWN IT. So, as a "shareholder" you own 1/265th of the entire park, but you do not exclusively own the property that your unit is sitting on. It's owned by ALL the shareholders.

Even though our Rules and Regulations (Resident Responsibilities, pgs. 21-22), state that unit owners are responsible for the area around their unit, no individual lot in Stonehedge can be claimed exclusively as "your" property since all the shareholders own the ground a unit sits on. Based on this, it would be improper to tell another shareholder not to come on "your" property (lot). BUT that said, BEST PRACTICES dictate that if you are going to come close to someone's unit, even to do them a favor, you would contact the shareholder/unit owner in advance.

PS: On maintaining the area around your Unit...for those with fruit or vegetable bearing plants please take steps to ensure that the fruit/vegetables are removed promptly WHEN RIPE to AVOID ROTTING that would attract unwanted critters ... rats, coyotes, snakes, raccoons, and yes, even iguanas!

Was that APPROVED?

Please remember that the Stonehedge Office should be your first stop if you have questions on any park-related matters.

Questions regarding whether an exterior change was approved should be directed to the Manager or a member of the Architectural Committee. Please be aware that no exceptions to the rules regarding exterior changes or additions are granted to Board members. If there are specific concerns or questions, contact the office.

** IMPORTANT NOTICE TO OWNERS **

REGARDING STONEHEDGE <u>TRANSFERS OF TITLE & CHANGES IN</u>
OWNERSHIP

ALL <u>TRANSFERS OF OWNERSHIP</u> and <u>CHANGES IN OWNERSHIP - such as a sale, adding an owner, removing an owner, death of an owner, creating a <u>Trust, creating a Life Estate - must be TRANSACTED THROUGH A CERTIFIED TITLE CLOSING AGENT or ATTORNEY.</u></u>

The STONEHDGE OFFICE must be <u>NOTIFIED IN ADVANCE</u> of ALL planned TRANSFERS (sales) or other CHANGES in OWNERSHIP (adding/removing owners, etc.)

The MASTER OCCUPANCY AGREEMENT requires that SRI through its officers, <u>APPROVE ALL TRANSFERS/CHANGES</u> of Title or Ownership.

For the protection of the Corporation (SRI) and for you as a shareholder, TRANSFERS DONE BY INDIVIDUALS <u>without the required SRI APPROVAL and COOPERATIVE DOCUMENTS will NOT BE ACCEPTED.</u>

If you have made a CHANGE to Title or Ownership <u>WITHOUT using</u> a Certified Agent or Attorney, and without the required <u>SRI</u>

<u>APPROVAL</u> and Cooperative Documents, contact the Stonehedge

<u>Office so that corrective steps can be taken.</u>

Please refer to the detailed information sheet included in this issue and contact the office with any questions.

WORTH REPEATING...

By now you know I can't leave you without a few reminders...

- Slow Down to our 15 MPH speed limit and STOP at STOP SIGNS in the park.
- Always leash your dog when outside your unit and when on

- golf carts.
- Park in the STREET, NOT ON THE SIDEWALK.
- Use extreme caution exiting the North Gate onto Mango Street. Let incoming vehicles go completely through the gate and past your car before you pull out to ensure you have a clear path to exit safely.



Refer to this information when you are considering making changes to your Unit's Title / Share Certificate...

Transfers of Title to your Home Changes to Title / Share Certificates

Stonehedge Residents Inc. is an incorporated for-profit company consisting of 265 shareholders/homeowners. For the protection of the corporation there are certain items that must be included when an ownership change to the title of a home is made.

Some changes include: (Not all are listed – please consult your title agent or attorney for others)

- Sale of a home
- ADDING a new owner or REMOVING a current listed owner
- Creating a life estate for the title
- Changing title into a Trust
- Change to the Trust agreement (date of Trust change) if already titled in the Trust

The above are the most common reasons that REQUIRE that a <u>NEW Assignment of the Occupancy Agreement</u> be created. Notify the Stonehedge Office in advance if you are planning a Transfer of Title or Change to Title/Share. Be sure to seek advice from your title agent or attorney regarding other situations that may require a NEW Assignment of the Occupancy Agreement.

** NOTE: FOR YOUR PROTECTION as well as the Corporation's, TRANSFERS MUST GO THRU A CERTIFIED AGENT. **

Transfers done by individuals will NOT BE ACCEPTED...NO EXCEPTIONS

The items below MUST be included when a New Assignment is written and RECORDED by your agent:

Joinder and Consent Form (provided by Title Agent to be signed by Board Officer(s) and Notarized)

What this means to you as an owner:

- Stonehedge on the Hill hereby joins in the execution of this Assignment of Proprietary Lease as to said lot and certifies that:
- a. The Cooperative has waived its right of first refusal for the purchase of the Unit granted under the Master Form Proprietary Lease Agreements
- b. The Cooperative has approved the purchase of the Unit by the assignee herein, and
- c. All assessments due to the Cooperative on the Unit have been paid in full, and there are no delinquencies as of the date hereof.
- <u>Search and Transfer of Titles:</u> This is to clear any title imperfections as well as finalizing the transfer of the Coach. This is for owner protection as well as the protection of the Corporation of which you are a member.
- <u>Assignment of Occupancy Agreement</u>: Stonehedge Residents Inc. office must receive the RECORDED document (original or copy) for the office files. This recorded document must contain the Parcel ID #.

CRUISING WITH THE DUNSTALLS

The Voyage of the Vikings continues to provide lots of new vistas to wonder at and lifestyles to ponder! We left you at the end of our first letter, in the August Beacon, having visited Bar Harbour, Maine, Sydney in Nova Scotia, and Corner Brook in Newfoundland, Canada.

Greenland is predominantly covered with ice, and **Iceland** is green! For each of these countries, we visited two remote towns/ villages where the lifestyles are plain and basic and livelihoods are made mostly from fishing. There is some hunting and some farming. The homes made of some wood, corrugated metal, or concrete are brightly painted, in sharp contrast to the rather grey and bleak mountainous background. All the people we talked to were very friendly, proud of their country, and very welcoming to us as visitors. The city we did visit in Iceland had all the commodities of a modern lifestyle such as we know it, but none of the fast food chains or other trappings of city life. The animal life we have seen includes lots of birds, dogs in the villages, beautiful wildflowers and cultivated flower gardens, as well as a pod of dolphins on the open sea.

Each location has a rich heritage and offers ways for the tourist to see and experience life from the early indigenous peoples in Greenland to the Vikings coming from Norway to Iceland, Greenland and beyond, to the developments of the medieval period as well as the Industrial Revolution. Throughout this trip we are being made very aware of the cultural and religious differences that have shaped this barren harsh land. In these two northern countries, the religious clashes pitted Norse pagans against the Christians. Christianity won.

Before leaving this furthermost northerly area, we did cruise the Prince Christian Sound of Greenland between our visits to the two countries. The scenery is beautiful with glaciers, icebergs, mountain peaks, and waterfalls created

by melting snow. There was one very isolated settlement of 100 people in a narrow coastal village. We did cruise across the Arctic Circle so we have now been in both the Antarctic circle and the Arctic. Cold, no matter how you say it!! Before and after going to Rotterdam in Holland, we visited towns and cities in Scotland and Ireland. Everywhere, but particularly on the North Sea, there are countless huge wind turbines and a scattering of oil rigs. Lerwick in the Shetlands and Stornoway in the Hebrides were small Scottish towns relying on fishing, farming, and tourism for a living. The small farms raise sheep, mostly for meat and for a much lesser extent than in the past, for the wool. The towns run a few streets wide long the coastline, with hills and mountains as a backdrop. The gardens are lush and the fields are green. There is evidence of Viking presence in the past with old architecture of stones dating back as far as 4000 years. Today, people live in rather small homes in the towns with some row housing.

In Ireland, our two ports were quite different from each other. Cobh, in the Republic of Ireland, is a small port town with Cork being the city about half an hour's drive away. With a break in the Irish "soft Rain", we were able to wander the narrow twisting streets of Cobh and visit the local stores. The Gothic catherdral towers over the town from its position on top of a hill, overlooking the shops and homes of the town folk. Once again we were treated to a visual delight of painted buildings contrasting with the bleak sea in front and hills behind. Belfast is a bustling maritime city in Northern Ireland. The Titanic was built here and its story contributes significantly to the tourism in the area. A bus tour took us along a narrow winding road that hugs the coastline and features beautiful ocean scenery on one side with lovely Irish green farms in the Glens on the other side. The towns we passed through had lovely homes with no evidence of poverty anywhere. Belfast has many ties to the history of the United States.

In this area there is a strong reminder of the wars that have waged for centuries here between the Catholics and the Protestants. Although the Church of England (Episcopalian) is not strictly a protestant church, it was the ruling power in the north and its battles with the south. These religious troubles within the Christian faith caused many to emigrate from Ireland and become a large immigrant population to head out for North America to seek religious freedoms. In the mid 1840's , many in Ireland were dying from starvation and the potato famine. The search for the land of milk and honey where the streets are paved with gold became the second big wave of migration from Ireland to the United States. The families gave many famous people to the history of the United States, such as Andrew Jackson and John Houston, just to name a couple.

As said earlier, we did fit in a stop in Rotterdam, the Netherlands between Scotland and Ireland. Rotterdam is the largest port in Europe. We watched the never-ending travel along the Rhine River from our window on the ship, mostly large barges and ships, with some personal and tourist-based travel. Owen was finally released from isolation and we were able to roam the neighbouring areas as long as our dwindling energy lasted!

We are building up a fresh supply of energy, and getting ready to set out on the last two weeks of out adventure. The highlights are sure to include our return to Iceland and Greenland.


Wet or not, the time has flown by: it's hard to believe that we'll be packing up to travel south a month from now! It's still not too late to brag




