

- Digital conversion Transition DATE: October
 9, 2018
- Each resident will receive a letter from Spectrum 1 MONTH prior to the transition date to explain your options

- You can call in to get the new box shipped to your home or you can bring in your old box
- You get 1 box FREE. If you do not have a box you still get 1 for FREE
- A TV WILL NOT GET RECEPTION IF YOU DO NOT HAVE A BOX- not even SMART TVs so if you have 3 TV's you will get one box free and have to pay for 2 boxes if you want the other TV's to work
- Each additional box is \$5.99 per month

Who does not need a new box:

- If you have an upgraded service like a DVR service from Spectrum – you do not need to change the box
- SPECTRUM WILL NOT SEND OUT A REP TO DISCUSS THE CONVERSION
- IF YOU HAVE QUESTIONS AFTER YOU RECEIVE THE LETTER FROM SPECTRUM (sometime in Sept)-COME TO THE OFFICE AND I WILL TRY TO HELP YOU WITH THE CONVERSION

Clubhouse floor scrubbing

Floors are done. Took 4 hours with a professional scrubber with 28" brushes. A lot of surface dirt and some in the grout lines – but the heavy stuff in the grout lines would not come out- no matter how many times we went over it. The place was soaped – while it sat we scrubbed the entire surface 3 if not 4 times as directed by the company who gave us a lesson on the machines use. We used 2x the cleaner strength that it called for with the chemical we were directed to use. Then vacuumed up the dirty water. The place came clean.




Waterlogged Soils - Alert

The recent rains and standing water deplete the oxygen in the soil and causes stress and damage on the turf. Your Specialist will help speed recovery with fertilizer (rebuilding roots) and by keeping other stresses at bay like chinch bugs, disease and weeds. Whether there was standing water for hours or days, this will affect turf in the upcoming weeks, as our turf is in a declining growth mode going into the shorter fall days. Aeration may be part of the recovery process

Key Points

- Waterlogged soils occur when more rain falls than the soil can absorb or the atmosphere can evaporate. Even our sandy soils won't immediately drain when heavy rains fall. Waterlogging occurs when roots cannot function properly due to excess water in the soil. This will cause short and long term effects since roots need oxygen to work propery.
- You may see yellowing on turf, and even decline or death in some areas of your lawn that
 remained submerged for extended periods of time. This is NOT a disease and is the roots
 have decomposed from being in water too long. A normal soil has a balance of air and
 water. This balance has been shifted to too much water.
- Water does not have to appear on the surface for waterlogging to be a potential problem.
- Your Specialist will apply the appropriate fertilizers for your lawn. They will use product that focus on encouraging new root growth. Aeration may also be recommended. Only parts of the lawn may be treated.
- Your Specialist will monitor for disease, insects and weeds. The next few weeks will tell if parts of your lawn decline to the point where turf replacement is needed.
- While your area suffered large levels of rain, our sandy soils dry out quickly. In a few weeks, the soils may need to be watered again! Look for leaf blades folding to tell you if your lawn needs water.

This chart shows ideal growing conditions for plants, including turf. Now imagine if there the air (oxygen) is only a small slice of the circle and the water has taken the majority of the space. The roots literally drown from a lack of oxygen (air).






SAVE THE DATE FOR THE


