

<u>Clubhouse roof repairs - continued from</u> October - waiting for schedule for Kontos roofing for the repairs to the area at the North end of the 3. Overflow parking: The back of the clubhouse storage room. This repair is for some rotted

plywood and damaged shingles. The repair is in the \$5000 range.

Shuffle Courts: Started 10/29/18 and should be done by the end of week 11/12 at the latest (depending on the weather).

Coyotes: We received a quote of nearly \$2000 to trap the coyotes. We discussed this with Tarpon Mayor at a recent coffee hour here at Stonehedge. He discussed with Pinellas county as well as Animal control and because they are not considered an aggressive species neither authority will do anything to trap them. We will continue our efforts of covering some holes and spreading predator deterrent in the areas they have been seen in. We caution each resident to take a bit of extra precaution until they are gone from Stonehedge property. DO NOT WALK AT **NIGHT**

CAUTION: They need to eat and if they do not find enough food in their area of nesting, they will attack unattended DOGS AND CATS.

Its getting cool which means time to cover the pool - there will be a sign up sheet on the bulletin board for those who are willing to help

Resident reminders:

- 1. Although parking on the street is allowed overnight, we prefer to keep the streets clear throughout the night as well as during the day. We have a lot of traffic due to work on homes as well as guests at this time. Thank you.
- 2. Parking on the sidewalks is not appreciated. Please DO NOT park on the sidewalks, and let your service vendors know the same. You are the line of defense - when you schedule a contractor please remind him before they come to please park in the street and not on the sidewalks. Thank you.





again everybody. Last month I invited you to be a spectator at one of our meets (that's what the entire day of play is called). Now I'm going to try to explain what you will be looking at as the meet unfolds.

PRACTICE

There are four courts played on during a meet, two players at the "head" where the scoreboards are, and two players at the "foot". Eight games are played per quarter. After the second set of eight games have been played there is a "halftime" period. After halftime, the remaining two quarters are played, for a total of 32 games. Each game won is worth one point. The home team (us) has practice from the time the courts are "beaded" (around 11 AM) until the visiting team is given the courts for their practice at noon. During the home team's practice time, the captains and co-captains from both teams meet privately to prepare the "lineups" which determine who plays who and at what location they will play. Players are matched against each other based on their placement on the team roster. Player #1 would be the highest winning player. That player would be matched against the visiting team's #1 player, and so on. The home team players, at the time they are practicing, will not know which court they are going to play on. They will also not know whether they will be playing at the "head" or the "foot". At noon, as our team is turning the courts over to the visitors for their practice, our captain will appear. Our captain will inform each player which court they are playing on, and whether they are at the "head" or the "foot" of that court. Note: The visiting team gets a bonus, because the visitors KNOW where they will be playing BEFORE they practice. At the end of the visitor's

practice time, 12:30 PM, the meet is ready to begin. There. I tried to explain that the best I could, you might have to read it again to fully understand it.

At 12:30, players take their seats next to their opponent. The home captain will welcome the visiting team and each captain will introduce the players at each location on the courts. Each player will "practice their colors" shooting their four disks. At the conclusion of these practice shots, the game bell will ring, and you will hear the order "yellow out!" "Referees take over." That will signal the beginning of play. Again, there will be eight games going on at the same time, two on each court. There will be one REFEREE for each court, four in all, two provided by each team. The home team also provides a HEAD REFEREE who decides any contested scoring of disks.

PLAY

There are ten "frames" in a game, and the result is very simple. The highest score after those ten frames earns ONE POINT for their team. The winner only needs to win by one point. Even if the winner outscores their opponent by a large number of points, the result is just ONE POINT. During games, the REFEREE is in charge and calls out the status of disks on the court after each shot. A "good disk" is a disk that is sitting INSIDE one of the scoring areas on the court. He will call "one black" if there is one good disk on the court and it is black. Now we should explain the scoring of points. Each court has a triangular area at each end, with three scoring areas that are positive and one area that is negative. The positive areas are 7, 8, and 10. The higher the points, the smaller the area. The negative area is minus 10. This area is at the back of the triangle and extends the width of the court. Referred to as "the kitchen" the referee will signify a disk in this area by circling with his index finger and calling "yellow in the kitchen." Knocking an oppoent into the kitchen represents the path to regaining control of many games where the

player who is behind can get back into contention. It is an exciting aspect of the game and players who can regularly "kitchen" their opponents are very successful. You can also accidentally shoot one of your own disks into the kitchen, which is unfortunate, even upsetting, but is all a part of the game. All "good" disks must reside COMPLETELY inside the scoring areas. They cannot touch one of the boundry lines. Close calls are decided and announced by the REFEREE. If requested, the referee will allow a player sitting at the end of the court closest to the disk to have a look at the location of the disk to see if they agree with the referee's decision. If the decision is challenged, the HEAD REFEREE is called to make the final decision on the disk. At the end of each frame, the referee calls the score for that frame to the SCOREKEEPER. The referee double checks the scorekeeper's work. The referee's other duties are to remind players which to distract the players and should never be beginning of the 9th and 10th frames, and to remove disks that do not reach the "lag line" a line about half way down the court which each disk must at least reach to be allowed to remain. on the court.

END OF EACH GAME

After the 10th frame is complete, the scorekeeper will indicate the winner by drawing a diagonal line across the top half of the scoreboard, and placing the high score above the line and the low score below the line. It is polite for the loser to congratulate the winner. Since four different courts are played on, games end at different times depending on the speed of which the players compete. Players having completed their games are required to remain seated until all games are finished. Quiet conversation may be carried on between frames and also while waiting for other games to be finished, however any excessive noise is distracting to players still competing and is to be refrained from. At the time all games are completed each captain will record the scores of the eight games, verify the

score with the other captain, and the team scores will be posted on the meet scoreboard. At this time, players will switch positions, the player who had YELLOW the first game will have BLACK for the second game. At the end of his second game, a player normally will not play again that day.


OTHER DUTIES

During the half in which a player is not playing in a game, the team captain will schedule them to assist in other ways. These players may be asked to REFEREE a game, may be asked to be a SCOREKEEPER or be asked to be the HEAD REFEREE.

SPECTATORS

Spectator chairs are placed along the sidelines prior to games. Spectators are encouraged and appreciated. Any conversations they carry on between themselves should not be loud enough color is "out" (shooting first), inform players of the instructional or disparaging in any way. No one is allowed in areas behind benches while games are underway.


Stonehedge Bowling
