

Managers Korner January 2018

Managers message is a repeat from last month but, being in that Holiday season I still feel it's appropriate.

Welcome to the Holiday Season. Everything we can think of that we have done year after year will be done again. Shopping, cooking, eating too much, naps, eating too much again, kids, cleanup and that all important relaxing deep exhale when it's all over. And of course, the words 'this is the last time we do this', which we all know is not true. Once we relax and unwind from the season we all realize we are grateful for what we have and most of all can provide to our family – like them or not- and friends. Please take to time to tell them or at least give them a silent thought of appreciation. They may not make you happy all the time, but thank them for the times they have.

Thank you for all those who attended and participated in the activities of the park, and for those who coordinated and ran them.

Since it's the holiday season I will not drill into you the needed maintenance on homes. You should know by now what needs to be done. But if you need reminders I will take my time to let you know. Again, please do not pay me to write you letters of compliance. It really is a waste of my time and your money.

The mailroom project is completed. We hope you like it. We are looking for creative ideas for holiday themes and designs to the center section of the area. We left that area open for ongoing themes, Valentine Hearts, St Paddy's Day 4 leaf clovers and the town drunk, etc – you get the idea. Bring those ideas to the office or the Board.

We (Shannon and I) were notified of and repaired 2 monster water leaks in the park – we think they were in the 100,000 gallon a month range. We will see for

sure when we get the report back from the City. A "Thank you" to unit 149 (Ms. Holden) for letting us know of 1 leak and to unit 150 (Dave and Debra Schuler) for providing us with ice water and clean towels while we worked in the ground in the heat of that day. One to unit 66 Barbara Smith who let us know about the other leak. Another "Thank you" to Gladys and Don Edwards who donated the poinsettias to the first official display in front of the mailroom.

Palm tree planting, for those who want them replaced, will be announced in the Feb Beacon with an attached form to submit their written request.

It's long way off, March 2018, but our Annual Meeting is the next one we expect your participation in. There will be 3 positions open – as of now. Please consider running if you feel you can contribute to the future well-being of your Park.

Lawns- I will be brief – those dry spots may be a brown spot fungus- caused by lawns being wet – watering – dew that does not dry out during the day – especially on the North sides of homes. Wells will be off until most likely 1/8 to give them a chance to dry out a bit. Also Tru Green will spray for the 3rd week in a row on the lawns we identified with this fungus. The lawns will also not be mowed until 1/9 – our lawn service is on holiday


January 30 – The Book Club will convene at the clubhouse at 7:00P to discuss John LeCarre's "Tinker, Tailor, Soldier Spy"

Turfgrass Diseases

A disease is an abnormal change in the natural growth and function of a turfgrass plant which is caused by another living organism. The organism that can cause a disease is called a pathogen.

Three important requirements must be present in order for a plant pathogen to cause a disease:

- Host the host in this case is a susceptible (capable of being infected) turfgrass plant
- Pathogen microorganisms that use the host turfgrass plant for food
- Environment Temperature, humidity, grass blade wetness and soil moisture can all affect both the host turfgrass plant and the pathogen

The key to controlling turfgrass diseases, as with any lawn pest, is proper identification. Since the pathogens causing the disease are microscopic, the TruGreen specialist must carefully examine the grass plants in a lawn to accurately determine if disease activity is present.

Leaf Spot is a common lawn disease of both cool and warm season turfgrasses. It begins during mild, wet conditions. Leaf spot then progresses in severity (called "melting out") as the temperatures heat up.

Necrotic Ring Spot is a patch disease of Kentucky bluegrass lawns. This disease attacks both the above- and below-ground plant tissues making it particularly devastating. Activity occurs as temperatures approach 80 degrees.

Brown Patch affects all species of cool season turf and is particularly severe on St. Augustinegrass in the south. Prolonged wet periods, warm (but not hot) temperatures and excessive fertilization are conditions that favor brown patch development.

Because we cannot control the environmental conditions that favor disease development, control of turfgrass diseases is typically not included as part of the TruGreen lawn care program. Some regions market control of certain diseases as an Expanded (or Beneficial) service. Further information regarding disease control offerings will be provided by local sales management.


