#### Manager's Korner

#### October 2018

The month of Sept has always been a thoughtful one. Every year we go through the changes of the summer, from the visits up North to see the families and grandkids to them visiting here in Florida, coupled with the Stonehedge snowbirds returning. Not to mention the beginning of budget season. This happens every year, but for some reason it always seems different. Hopefully you are not bored with it, because your enthusiasm is what makes others look forward to their family trips, their vacations and simply just the away from the daily routine life. We all need that routine way more often then not to keep our feet grounded. Keep traveling, keep laughing, for those are the memories we remember best. See you all soon.

Summer has been a hot one, duh, Florida, but nothing unusual. Great rains, beautiful sunsets and relaxing times.

#### **Projects recap:**

<u>Seal Coat</u> – (approx. \$16,000) roads done and added 14 stencils for 15MPH and as usual we still get some who don't care and speed as well as blowing through stop signs. I guess if you don't get caught then its OK. Inconsiderate.

<u>Clubhouse floors polished.</u> (\$300) We rented a professional machine and scrubbed the entire clubhouse in 4 hours

Garage and Mailroom roofs replaced- (\$6300) the mailroom was replaced with a metal roof. The garage with shingles since its less in the public eye Gas Heater and Pool Filter grids replaced-(\$3800) The pool heater bit it earlier in the year and we waited till Sept to replace since there was no reason to push chlorinated water thru the pipes for months without the need to heat it.

Air Compressor- The garage air compressor took a hit during one of our thunder storms. We are in the process of replacing it (approx. a \$250 cost)

Clubhouse Generator- We investigated the possibility of adding a generator to the clubhouse.

We had a representative from Generac come out and do a detailed study of our needs. With a discounted Generator it was above \$40,000 for this project. The board decided at this time it was not cost effective. One of the helpful factors in deciding to decline was the fact that Stonehedge is fed from 2 independent electrical locations according to Duke who was called in to do a study as well. One to the South and one from the North. Which means that the likelihood of all 265 homes and the clubhouse being without power is far less likely than most.

Shuffle courts- SOB's- Nidy company has a hold on re-surfacing the courts- we contacted 6 different concrete and sports related companies, and all suggested to call Nidy- no one else would re-surface them. We contacted the former chairman of the Shuffle Association for the County and he suggested the same. We signed the contract in July and it will not be until mid-October before they can come. We have been hounding them since we signed the contract because they told us they were only 30 days out at the time. So much for honesty.

<u>Lawns-</u> The rains have been a huge plus in the recovery of and maintaining our lawns. Along with our pest and weed control company efforts we are looking very good.

<u>Coyote Caution</u>: Slight bit of caution- it has never been an issue and we do not see it being one in the future but...

There have been coyote's sighted at and around the retention pond here at Stonehedge. We have worked on controlling the wandering in the park situation by, yes, believe it or not purchasing Wolf Urine. And, of course where do you buy Wolf Urine but at the Pee Store, really! The wolf is a natural predator of the coyote and since we have put up a barrier around the retention pond the sightings have been minimal but still seen in the park. Recently one strolled down Azalea and went out the back gate. Mmmm? Wonder where he got a clicker!

CAUTION: They need to eat and if they do not find enough food in their area of nesting, they will attack unattended DOGS AND CATS.

#### The Landscape Article

Tis the in between season – we can go either way – not that there is anything wrong with that. The rainy season has left most yards in great shape for the fall season. Yards have come thru so far with almost no fungus issues and have seen no chinch bug issues that we are constantly monitoring along with TruGreen our pest control company as well as Evans Lawn service. This year as well as the recent past we have had excellent communication between all service providers, and it shows

Now, about going either way, we can get the regular rains weekly or none at all. That is for Mother Nature to decide and for you to check out the results and adjust your programs to.

The few yards that have been affected this year have been treated and the visual effects will remain for some time until the healthy grass fills in. This will take some effort on your part to inspect to see if the treatments have worked. Best way to see if the treatments have worked is to mark the affected area with a flag and see if it spreads about 3 days later. Also keep an eye on the affected area(s) because weeds normally sprout up before the healthy grass fills in. This may take some time as we know in Florida weeds grow faster than grass, or at least faster than the weeds they call grass here.

This is where you come in to aid the already in place park preventative program. Keep an eye on the dead area for further spreading. Leave the dead grass there and see if it fills in. St Augustine grass grows on runners and it the area is clear of pests then it should fill in with some care.

Any general lawn pest control product will do, Bayer brand is one of the better ones. If you care to sod after the area has been cleaned up, that is the best time to do this or you can wait for the stronger grass to fill in, either way it's your choice.

Another way to combat reoccurring weeds that find their way in between your healthy lawn or grow in those bare spots is to please use a separate weed killer – weed and feed combination fertilizer and weed killers are only recommended in the colder months (Dec, Jan, Feb), I don't recommend them at all. Reason is that cooler months tend to kill out weeds faster and do not need much additional help. Best to put as little product into the environment as possible.

October and November is the season to enjoy seasonal annuals and the cool weather blooming plants.

NOTE: I cannot stress this enough. When looking for seasonal plantings (Annuals) or even year-round plantings (Perennials), its best to check out the neighborhood and see what has survived and what looks good. Use the experience that is around you Use the internet, it's the next best source other than your neighborhood. Tarpon Springs is in ZONE 9 when choosing new plants.

I have direct experience with their garden shops and the knowledge is limited at best. PLEASE DO NOT TAKE THE PLANT LABELS SERIOUS ON THESE GARDEN CENTER PLANTS. If you insist on shopping at these garden centers I suggest you ask a test question or 2 to see if you get the correct answer, such as "are weed and feeds good to use year round?" The answer is "NO" unless you have a completely spotless lawn that needs no other attention, and I doubt that in Florida. There is a reason these stores are called "do it yourself"

October is also the time you should look at the plants that did not make it thru the hot summer months or those that took extra special care. Unless you have the extra time to fuss with them its best to consider options. This may mean that they are not suited to take the heat and should be changed out. If you care to, replace them with more suitable plants that can take the torrid summer months.

It's also the time to make sure you are prepared for the next years growing season. This can be done by strengthening the lawn you have. A good all-purpose fertilizer for this time is one with a high end number:

To recap fertilizers from previous articles: (the following have been detailed much further in previous articles) Using an example of a good fertilizer labeled as a 18-5-10

18- The first number is the nitrogen parts per million for greening

5- is for phosphorous, which is a natural element in the Florida soil, so you do not need to add any at this stage

10- is for potassium (potash) which helps strengthen the root system.


You have the next 2 months to be able to add this to you soil to strengthen it even more than the natural rains did.

Over the next 2-3 months we will be discussing the do's and don'ts of fall and winter gardening. The current Don't is – DO NOT OVERWATER if we get cooler weather (80's in the day, 70's night)
