

A TALE FROM THE SOUTH PACIFIC

We are a little over the halfway point of our 51-day cruise through some islands of the South Pacific. These islands are mostly a result of volcanic action, some of which is still ongoing; consequently, the high hillsides are very fertile and covered with dense vegetation. The highlight in Hawaii for us was the botanical gardens in Hilo on the island of Hawaii. The steep hillside down to the sea was covered with magnificent towering trees of a tropical rain forest with unimaginably beautiful flowers blooming in the undergrowth. 30,000 to 40,000 years ago, the population of the South Pacific Islands began, with many of the current native populations having arrived three to four thousand years ago. Migration from west to east came from present day Tanzania, Taiwan, New Zealand, and Australia to Papua, New Guinea and from there further eastward to the islands of Polynesia. Scientific evidence as well as the continuing traditional cultural practices today show us that all these islands have many commonalities; nevertheless, they still formed separate distinct tribes and had tribal warfare. Today they appear to live in harmony. Colonialism dominated the 1800's and early 1900's, resulting not only in the further development of the agricultural industries but also a great depletion of the native population due to European diseases. To build a labour force, people were brought in from China, Japan, and India. These peoples brought their culture with them and added to the local practices, particularly in cuisine and religion. Eventually it become not as profitable for the greedy foreign investors who moved operations to other parts of the world and now the islands are developing even more tourism to survive.

As of this date, our two favourite islands are very small, populated by native people who live off the land and the sea. They are poor in terms of our standards, but very rich in terms of happi- ness, love of the land, love of family, and reverence for ancestry and traditions. Both have schools. The people live in very basic shelters with limited

conveniences. Power comes from solar panels and possibly generators fueled by some form of petrol. The fishing boats are small with 10 horsepower motors and are a part of daily life when the cruise ship is not there! The daily diet includes seafood, tropical fruits, and root vegetables. There are chickens, pigs, and dogs, as well as flies! Cooking is done over fires. Water is collected in huge rain barrels with piping coming off the metal roof. At both of these islands, we left school supplies. When a cruise ship is anchored offshore, the whole population turns out to welcome and entertain us. The fishing boats become a means for transporting cruise passengers around the island. The school children were along the shore singing for us. The adults were selling handcrafts.

Evidence is abundant that this part of the world gets support and funding from Australia, New Zealand, Japan, Korea, and Canada, some of it through the United Nations. America Samoa appears to receive the least amount of support, even from the US to which it belongs. It is valued for is deep harbour.

The port cities are just that, port cities. There is a hustle and bustle in the harbour and in the cities themselves. The markets are lively. Everywhere we have been, English is spoken, as well as the local language. In most places of business, the US dollar is accepted. Some smaller privately owned business do give a better price if purchasing is done in local currency. So far, we have been to four Hawaiian islands, Fanning Island in the country of Kiribati, American Samoa and Samoa, and four stops in Fiji. Everywhere we go the people are friendly and very welcoming. The children are so cute and happy. The attitude to us as tourists is heartwarming; they appreciate our expressions of fondness for their islands; they accept our "No thank you" when asked to buy their products or services with a smile and a "Thank you". How refreshing!
