### Manager's Korner Stonehedge things: No ongoing projects to speak about at this time

Maintenance man - As most of you may know we have a new maintenance man. His name is Art. He has been with us since January 7th this year. He is a hard worker who has experience working on Condos and Hoa's with Ameri-Tech on other properties. He has been quick to learn and eager to do so. He has proven to be friendly and cooperative to the association and residents. There is a lot to learn here at the Park and I feel he will fit in nicely.

Parking on sidewalks - The Board only asks that residents to be considerate of your neighbors. You are the first line of defense to let contractors know to not park on the sidewalks. Simple, when a contractor is scheduled, tell them to park completely in the street or when the arrive at your home let them know. I have consistently had to tell contractors, who politely move their vehicles. This is something you as a homeowner should be concerned about.

Parking on the Street. There is no overnight rule that you cannot park on the street overnight. With narrow enough streets and a 55+ community it is strongly requested that you do not park overnight making it more difficult to drive at night on our roads. I have seen some cars parked overnight when there is plenty of room in the carport, some even empty. Again, this is just a matter of courtesy. During the day when the park is full and there are plenty of contractors in and out of the park your car just remains another obstacle for residents to maneuver around.

**Dogs off leash** – This is an ongoing issue – and it should not be - It is inconsiderate to your neighbors and of park rules. As well as being a Pinellas County restriction along with not tethering your dog unattended - which also happens in the park. Neither I, nor your neighbor, nor the people who voted on the rules, care how well behaved your dog is.

As it has repeatedly been mentioned at meetings, in the rules book, and in the newsletter, if you don't like a rule as stated then you have every opportunity and right to petition to get it changed, but no right to disregard it before that.

**Spectrum proposal.** Spectrum representative Tom O'Halloran is expected to visit during coffee hour on **February 6** to discuss any issues that residents may have in understanding the proposal for WIFI. Please plan to attend. From our ongoing efforts to educate residents on this vote it is a very cost saving proposal for well over a majority of residents.

A REMINDER even if you do not currently have WIFI in your home. The proposal includes 2 free boxes for the life of the proposal. So, if you do not have WIFI and have a box or 2 or more, you will be saving \$8 per standard box\* once the "one box free" promotion is over. The initial proposal adds approximately \$27.27 to our monthly fees (minus the \$8-\$16 or more for the box cost), you may effectively only be paying \$11-19 for WIFI monthly.

\*Standard box is just that (no recordable features), if you have a recordable box you will still be billed separate for that recordable feature box.

### Landscape Knowledge from Pinellas County Extension University of Florida

Hello Everyone,

It is the time of the year again – you might have guessed it, I am not only referring to the Holidays. I am writing to remind you to skip a week of irrigation during the cooler months of December, January and February.

According to the University of Florida, grass doesn't need to be watered as often during the cooler months. In fact, this time of the year,

St. Augustinegrass only needs one-half to three quarters of an inch of irrigation-water every 10-14 days.

Overwatering does not only waste water it also can encourage pests and diseases in the landscape. Skipping a week of watering is as easy as 'off' for community associations and residents with irrigation timers. Turn the timer to 'off' for the week that you want to skip, and 'on' for the week that you want to water,"

You can determine when your grass needs water when

- Grass blades are folded in half lengthwise.
- Grass appears blue-gray in color.
- Footprints remain on the lawn for several minutes after walking on it.

Watering only every other week or less during the winter will not only improve landscape health, it will also help to conserve drinking water and protect our resources. Therefore start "skipping" today and spread the word among your friends, neighbors and clients.
