Stonehedge progress;

<u>Clubhouse roof repairs -</u> for the portion over the storage room – scheduled for January <u>Shuffle courts -</u> Done? LAWN Fact Sheet

BROWN PATCH OF ST. AUGUSTINEGRASS

Brown Patch is a disease occurring on the leaves of most warm season grasses. It most commonly occurs on St. Augustinegrass. The disease can be a severe problem when warm temperatures and high air humidities exist for a long period of time. Brown Patch forms large (2 to 50 ft.) circular patches of brown grass.

Occurrence

Brown Patch disease can be a problem anywhere St. Augustinegrass is grown if warm temperatures and high humidities exist. Even in arid climates, Brown Patch can occur on irrigated turf.

Pathogen and Symptoms

Brown Patch is caused by a fungus, *Rhizoctonia solani*, which survives in the soil, and the thatch, as well as in crowns



of the grass. Initial symptoms of infection are water-soaked areas on the leaf blades. Once dry, they wither and turn light brown. Lawn symptoms occur as straw-colored, circular patches ranging from 2 to 50 feet in diameter. The affected grass is closely pressed to the soil surface creating a sunken appearance. If humidity is high, patches of diseased grass may be bordered by dark grayish-purple rings (especially early in the day when the grass is wet). Blighted grass may easily be pulled up because the rot occurs at the point of leaf attachment. In some cases the turfgrass may thin out in large areas, without the characteristic circular rings.

This is common in shaded wet lawns.

Leaf spots can occur with or without the whole lawn symptoms described above. Leaf spots begin as small dark spots, which enlarge and may cover the entire leaf blade. Centers of the enlarged spots are a tan to straw color with a dark, brown border.

Conditions That Favor The Disease

Brown Patch development is very rapid at temperatures between 80° and 85° F. and when the humidity is high. When plant surfaces are wet, rapid development and spread of the disease is especially favored. Disease development is slower at cooler temperatures. There is little disease activity below 70° F.

Control

Because Brown Patch disease is caused by a soil-borne microorganism, control of this disease is difficult. Modifying cultural practices to reduce prolonged leaf wetness at night is helpful. Avoid watering in the evening. Improve air circulation (prune shrubs and trees) to help dry out wet turf areas. Mow at the proper cutting height and frequency to prevent further stress to the lawn. Research results indicate proper fertilization practices maintain a healthy, actively growing plant, which helps to reduce disease severity. Where fungicides are warranted, timing of applications is critical for effective control of Brown Patch.

Spectrum Proposal

The SRI Board has decided to submit the Spectrum proposal for a vote by the residents at our Annual Meeting in March. The Budget and Finance Committee met with Thomas O'Halloran from Spectrum on December 7, 2018.

The proposal was discussed in detail and some billing comparisons were made to the benefit of many residents. Below is a description of the proposal and answers to many of our questions.

Mr. O'Halloran will come back and answer any of your questions at a Wednesday morning coffee hour before the vote in March at an announced meeting for all residents to bring their questions before it goes to your vote.

As of the date of the meeting there were 182 residents (68%) with internet services. Acceptance of the proposal requires 75% approval of our 265 units. (199 yes votes)

The proposal is called Bulk Double Play, \$48.50 per unit plus fees and taxes (=\$55.27), Currently we pay \$28 for 90 or so channels, so the additional \$27.27 will make the full Spectrum deal \$55.27 which includes the Internet, 2 free boxes and the 300+ channel TV service

Please take your time and examine your current bill and compare it to what you get in return

- A. The cost of the services in the proposal without a group contract is about \$85/month (a little less in some cases).
- B. The savings will vary for everyone based on the services they currently have or don't have in the proposal.
 - > What you gain:

Platinum TV lineup 300+ TV channels -- with our current deal we only have 90 channels We currently pay \$28 for only 90 channels that is included in our monthly fees

What you gain

2 free HD boxes (non-recording) for the 5 years of the deal.

What you do not pay for anymore

your current bill for the boxes you now pay for or will pay (\$8 each) for after the free year is up

> What you gain

100x10 Internet service throughout your home thru a wireless modem

> What you do not pay for anymore

Current internet bill - you will no longer be billed directly for your internet service in your home

NOTE: Spectrum would only bill individuals for extra services such as DVR recording boxes, phone, additional cable boxes, and premium channels.

- The bottom line is you get 300+ channels, 2 free non recording HD boxes and internet for the 5 years of the deal for a total of \$55.27 (again this includes the current \$28 billing for our TV service). Note: The proposal would be a 5-year agreement with a maximum increase of 5% per year.
- The cost of the proposal would increase our monthly HOA fee by \$27.27. and will be added onto our current monthly fees. (\$55.27 total for new deal minus the \$28 for our current deal= \$27.27) but again you do not get a home bill for internet or for the HD boxes for the 5 years

In Addition, if approved:

The HOA would receive a \$39,600 Signing Bonus check. It has been recommended by the Budget & Finance Committee that it will be reserved for Capital work to replace water lines to reduce costly leaks.

Example of a Typical Spectrum Bill:

All home bills are different – according to Tom O'Halloran from Spectrum it depends on when you signed up and what promotions were going on at the time- so your charges most likely are different but you can use this as a comparison to what you are currently getting billed and what your home cost and association dues will be like before and after (if the plan is approved by 75% of all homeowners)

DUES: \$1.50/wk/person, to be used to subsidize the end-of-year Pool party (pizza & subs, drinks, bring your own).


