MANAGER'S KORNER MARCH 2020 TONY TOSCANO I cannot apologize for letting

the residents know what one of my major responsibilities is as a manager. I would not be fulfilling my duties to each resident if I did not do this portion of my job. No one individual is being singled out by any means and the following have all been observed in the past month – most in the past week – but I assure you it's unfortunate that many are ongoing in the past 14 years I have managed Stonehedge. I much rather tell you stories and give updates to preventative or improvement projects around the park, but I would be lacking in my responsibility to you who pay me to enforce and to remind residents of their responsibility of ownership in Stonehedge, a deed restricted community.

At first, I wanted to publish the entire rules book. It discusses the limitations that each homeowner has agreed to, whether you agree or disagree with the written rules, you agreed to adhere to them when you purchased.

If you don't like them there are ways to vote to change them – DON'T BREAK THEM FIRST The following rules that have not been adhered to; I have personally witnessed in the most recent past. The above statement applies to every resident. Stonehedge is not a great place to live because of the rules that are broken or bent, but because of those who adhere to them.

Please do not take any comments personally. I repeat, they are not directed at any one individual since the below have been neglected by more than one individual. It's my job and my responsibility to give you what you pay for. Just like it's owner responsibility to give your neighbor what they paid for.

I also want to remind residents that it's your rule book but Management rules also. If there

are items that I have overlooked or neglected that need to be cleaned, fixed or corrected I appreciate you reminding me of my responsibility as well to maintain the park.

Below is exact wording out of your Rules and Regulations Booklet:

A major prerequisite for admittance to Stonehedge on the Hill is that the prospective resident (or short-term renter) inform himself of each rule and regulation. That this prerequisite has been met will be confirmed during the interview process of all perspective residents.

<u>Mobile Home sites #3.</u> The Board, with the cooperation of our residents, assumes responsibility for the total appearance of our Park.

If a resident's plan of action is not included, the resident shall consult with the Park Manager BEFORE taking action. <u>PLEASE NOTE</u> <u>THAT FOR ANY QUESTIONS OR DISCREPENCIES,</u> <u>THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAKES THE FINAL</u> <u>DECISION.</u>

Speeding

<u>Vehicles #1.</u> The speed limit in the Park is fifteen (15) miles per hour.

General Maintenance of home

Mobile Home Sites #8. Mobile home lots and all structures are to be maintained to satisfactory standards established by the Board. The resident is responsible for the maintenance of his own lot. If a resident plan to be away from home for any length of time, he should make arrangements to have his lot maintained (water, trimming of bushes, fertilizing, etc.).

Excessive storage around home

Mobile Home Sites #5. Storage of items under or

around the mobile home, or on carports, is not permitted. Only furniture, specifically designed for outside use, shall be used outside the mobile home.

General Parking and driving

<u>Vehicles #10.</u> No parking is permitted on sidewalks or yards. Golf carts are not permitted to be parked or driven on yards or the Park common grounds except in areas designated by the Board.

Mobile home sites #9.

Travel trailers, campers, boats, including canoes, are not permitted in driveways or at mobile home spaces except for two (2) days to load and unload (overnight).

Parking at Clubhouse

<u>Vehicles #11</u>. Unit owner's RV and other vehicles may be parked only in designated area at the rear of the Clubhouse for a period not to exceed five (5) days in any thirty (30) day period.

Dress code and general clothes drying

General rules #21. Dress Code:

A dress code is required when residents or guests are not on a homeowners' premises. This includes footwear, beach robes or shirts over shorts or bathing suits. (No bare tops.) Laundry #6.

No drying racks, lines or laundry shall be hung or placed on carports or side yards. No swimwear or towels are to be hung on chairs, drying racks or lines on carports, side yards, or screen porches to dry.

Signs on property

General #12.

No other signs or advertising materials will be permitted to be posted on the mobile home or the mobile home space. If you desire, a sign not to exceed four by six (4" x 6") inches advertising a mobile home for sale or giving notices, may be placed on the designated park bulletin board inside the clubhouse.

Kids driving golf carts

<u>Vehicles #2</u>. Pedestrians have the right of way. No one under 16 may drive a motorized vehicle.

Animals off leash

<u>Pets #4.</u> Cats and dogs in the pet section outside the home must be under control at all times, either on a leash or within an invisible fence system.

Dogs walking in non-dog areas

<u>Pets #5</u>. a) No pets are allowed in common areas, recreational areas, Clubhouse building, streets except to cross, or yard of other residents without permission.

And a reminder of one that may cause you time and your money in the future if you decide to sell your home:

<u>General rules</u>: Transfers of the Cooperative Units are governed under the Bylaws of SRI and Florida Statutes Chapter 719.

To explain – you CANNOT transfer (change or add names to) the title of the home without legally transferring the share. Both share and titles MUST match exactly, if not, it will cost you time and money prior to sale.

NO BUSINESS WASTE (Waste associated with operation and maintenance of property cannot be accepted). Please refer to www.pinellascounty.org/solidwaste/sgg.htm.

How to package & transport chemicals:

- (1) Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- (2) Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.
- (3) Place containers into cardboard boxes, use crumpled newspaper to prevent breakage and keep chemicals upright and separated.
- (4) Place leaky container in clear plastic bag and transport in boxes with newspaper.
- (5) Individual chemical containers need to be visible for examination by staff.
- (6) Put boxes in the trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.
- (7) Tape battery terminals, or place each battery in a plastic bag to prevent short-circuits. Alkaline batteries should be disposed of in the garbage.

Desire, Ability and Opportunity.

You can have a significant impact on the last one **Opportunity** and reduce crime by following these simple crime prevention tips.

AT HOME

- Use a door viewer before opening your door. Always demand identification from strangers (even repair or sales persons).
- Always lock up your home before leaving and don't hide your house keys outdoors anywhere.
- Have keys ready and in your hand for immediate use when you return home.
- Use interior and exterior lighting at all times.

• Shred credit card offers and bank statements before you throw them away if you do not plan on using them.

- Hide or destroy boxes from expensive purchases.
- Do not answer personal questions about your home such as type of alarm, daytime occupancy, etc.
- Do not let people inside your home (to use the bathroom, phone, etc.).
- Avoid mail theft by dropping off outgoing mail at the local post office.
- Do not give out your personal information or credit card number over the phone unless you initiated the call.
