The Landscape Article October 2020 By the landscape guy

I hope you have come thru the extreme weather changing conditions that we have faced the last month. We have had a month of monster rains then 2 weeks of very dry and recently have experienced on and off rains. We have been lucky so far since this is prime chinch bug weather, Our monthly treatments have held up so far this year

If any areas of your lawn that are dying off and spreading please report them to the office. Some of those dead areas will come back with some care. This is where you come in to aid the already in place park preventative program. The best way to combat weeds is to clean up that portion of the dead –by raking out the dead portion and putting down a pest control product to aid the already in place controls. This will assure that any remaining pests will be under control when the healthy grass starts to fill in. Any general lawn pest control product will do, Bayer brand is one of the better ones. If you care to sod after the area has been cleaned up, that is the best time to do this or you can wait for the stronger grass to fill in, either way it's your choice.

Another way to combat reoccurring weeds that find their way in between your healthy lawn or grow in those bare spots is to please use a separate weed killer – weed and feed combination fertilizer and weed killers are only recommended in the colder months (Dec, Jan, Feb), I don't recommend them at all. Reason is that cooler months tend to kill out weeds faster and do not need much additional help. Best to put as little product into the environment as possible.

It's the time of year to enjoy seasonal annuals and the cool weather blooming plants. It's also the time to make sure you're prepared for the next years growing season. It can be done by strengthening the lawn you have. A good all-purpose fertilizer for this time is one with a high-end number:

Using an example of a good fertilizer labeled as a 18-5-10

- 18- The first number is the nitrogen parts per million for greening
- 5- is for phosphorous, which is a natural element in the Florida soil, so you do not need to add any at this stage
- 10- is for potassium (potash) which helps strengthen the root system.

You have the next 2 months to be able to add this to you soil to strengthen it even more than the natural rains did.

October is also the time you should look at the plants that did not make it thru the hot summer months or those that took extra special care. Unless you have the extra time to fuss with them its best to consider options. This may mean that they are not suited to take the heat and should be changed out. If you care to, replace them with more suitable plants that can take the torrid summer months. Best to look up plants suited for our zone (zone 9) on the internet or ask the local nursery (not Home Depot or Lowes-

I have direct experience with their garden shops and the knowledge is limited at best. PLEASE DO NOT TAKE THE PLANT LABELS SERIOUS ON THESE GARDEN CENTER PLANTS. If you insist on shopping at these garden centers I suggest you ask a test question or 2 to see if you get the correct answer, such as "are weed and feeds good to use year round?" The answer is "NO" unless you have a completely spotless lawn that needs no other attention, and I doubt that in Florida. There is a reason these stores are called "do it yourself"

Over the next 2-3 months we will be discussing the do's and don'ts of fall and winter gardening. See you next month

BAGUETTES RECIPE

Shirley Duffield's Brochette recipe in the last Beacon spoke of French Baguettes. Here is a recipe for French Baguettes that looks hard but is really very simple. The only hard part is all the waiting time in between the many risings and then waiting until it's cool enough to eat.

2-1/4 tsp dry yeast (1 packet, <u>not</u> rapid rise!)
1-2/3 c warm water
3-1/2 c bleached flour
1-1/2 tsp salt

- Sprinkle yeast into 1-1/4 c of the warm water in a bowl. Leave for 5 minutes to dissolve. Mix flour and salt in a large bowl and make a well in the center. Pour in dissolved yeast.
- Use a wooden spoon to draw only enough of the flour into the dissolved yeast to make a soft paste. Cover the bowl with a dish towel and let sit until frothy and risen, 20 minutes.
- Mix in the remaining flour. Add the remaining warm water only as needed, 1 tablespoon at a time to form a soft, sticky dough.
- Turn out onto a lightly floured work surface. Knead until soft, smooth and supple, about 10 minutes. Try to avoid adding in extra flour while kneading the dough.
- Put the dough in a clean bowl and cover with a dish towel. Let rise until doubled in size, about 1-1/2 hours.
- Punch down dough, re-cover, and let rise for 45 minutes longer. Then, punch down again, re-cover, and let rise until doubled in size, about another 45 minutes.
- Divide the dough into two equal parts and shape into two baguettes, each about 12" long. Place on a floured baking sheet, cover with a dish towel, and let sit until doubled in size, about 50 minutes.

Cut several diagonal slashes across the top and bake in preheated 475 degree overnight for 20 -25 minutes, until golden and hollow sounding when tapped underneath. Cool on a wire rack.




IS WE IS OR IS WE AIN'T?
