Projects: Priority ONE Delinquency Collection Matters

As of January 15, 2023 there were 55 collection matters on our books that needed to be addressed, some months behind, some only a month or a partial month behind. Needless to say they added up to thousands of dollars that belong in the associations (your) business account.

A reminder of the assessment delinquency letter that was sent to all residents: After February 5th 2023 any monthly assessments not paid for 2023 will be assessed an additional \$25 as well as a 10% interest charge. Any Special Assessments not paid by January 31st 2023 will be assessed an

additional 5% delinquency fee as well as a 10% interest charge.

NOTE: I have attempted, either via e-mail or phone call, to contact all 55 of those that show a delinquency on our records.

Other stuff:

Activity Committee Election is February 8th. All voting ballots were mailed to each resident. Please participate in getting to know the candidates and vote. This is for the "Fun Bunch" of the community. Parties, Activities, Crafts, Cards etc. Although for fun, it is still a major part of the business that is run in the park so it is important that a cohesive Board is elected.

SRI Board elections: You should have all received the 1st notice with the Intent to Run form in it – If, and only if, you have intentions to run fill out the form and return it to the office by Feb 3.

The 2nd mailing which will be mailed to all homeowners on Feb 13th, will include those candidates who have intentions of being a SRI Board member. The Ballot for your vote will also be included in that mailing









FRIENDLY SHUFFLE FOLLIES
