

### ***IN OTHER NEWS...***

**-Well 80:** The drilling of a new well is in progress at the time of this writing.

**-Landscape Beautification** at the North Gate and the Mailboxes was completed in June.

**-A new ADJUSTABLE SHOWER HEAD at the Pool Shower was recently installed.**

### **IRRIGATION SYSTEMS...**

-Regular maintenance by OWNERS is necessary to ensure systems are running at their best.

-This means **FREQUENTLY CHECKING sprinkler HEADS, sprinkler FILTERS, around the "doughnut," and then CLEANING as needed.**

-Be sure YOU or YOUR DESIGNATED **CARETAKER** are keeping up with this regular maintenance. **Sediment can build up quickly and limit pressure.**

-The Responsibility for maintaining your sprinkler system does not stop during your time away.  
**Check-in frequently with your designated sprinkler caretaker.**

## About Sprinkler System Maintenance

-The **only** sprinkler system maintenance that Residents or their Caretakers should be doing is: REPLACING BROKEN HEADS; CHECKING/TESTING Timers; and CLEANING HEADS, FILTERS, NOZZLE SCREENS, and DOUGHNUTS.

**-Repairs that involve DIAPHRAGMS, VALVES, or SOLENOIDS** should be REFERRED TO THE OFFICE or submitted on a **WORK ORDER** for **SRI Maintenance Staff to address.**

-When SRI Maintenance does a repair, the Resident is charged at cost only for the Parts that need to be replaced, except for parts (heads) broken BY VENDOR EQUIPMENT.

-TIMER ADJUSTMENTS need to be done by SRI Staff.

-VALVE repair/replacements should NOT be done by Residents. Submit requests on a WORK ORDER.

**-Any Work or Repair that involves the MAIN LINE must be done by SRI Staff.**  
**Submit Work Order.**

## DRESS CODE REQUIRED 😊

Remember ... and be sure to tell your Guests and Visitors too ... that Stonehedge has a Rule that requires a dress code when residents or guests are not on a homeowners' premises. **This includes footwear, beach robes, or shirts over shorts or bathing suits. No bare tops.**

## STREET PARKING REMINDERS

-Park in the direction of THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC on that side of the road.

**-Stay a safe distance AWAY FROM intersections & driveways so you don't block others' visibility or access.**

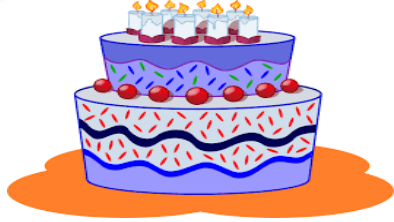
**-DO NOT PARK NEAR THE NORTH GATES.** From the north side of Druid to the Gates, both sides of the street should remain clear.

**-If there are vehicles parked on the opposite side of the street from where you want to park, leave enough room for traffic to flow easily around both vehicles. Even better: Park on the SAME SIDE as the other parked vehicle.** (This might be especially helpful on Azalea and Skyline.)

-If you must park one of your vehicles on the street, consider parking the smaller one (lower profile) on the street.

**-Be aware that a street-parked vehicle can be AT RISK OF DAMAGE from**

**-Emergency Response Vehicles must have access.**

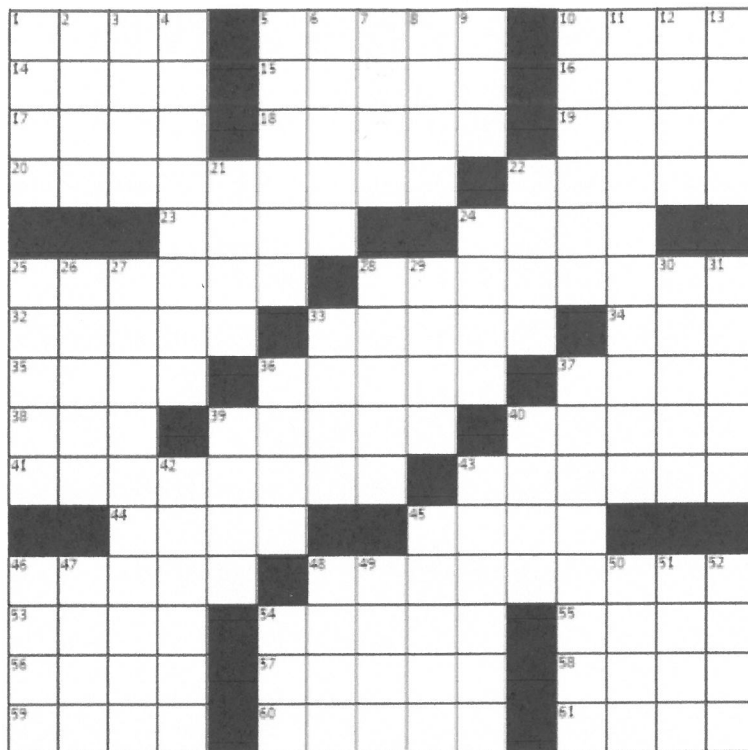

### Alert Pinellas

Free emergency notification system. Get alerts via text, phone and/or emails. **Sign up at [pinellas.gov/AlertPinellas](https://pinellas.gov/AlertPinellas)**

### Ready Pinellas mobile app

Personalize emergency plans, use checklists, save insurance information, contacts, create an inventory and more. Emergency notifications will be sent to your phone when possible. This app is also offered in Spanish.

### disaster.pinellas.gov

Basic information to prepare, up-to-the-minute updates during emergencies, and information after the emergency.

### Emergency Weather Radios

- Get automatic alerts from the National Weather Service (NWS).
- Configure radio to receive Pinellas County alerts only by using the Specific Area Message Encoding (SAME). **The SAME code for Pinellas County is 012103.**
- If the radio does not require a SAME, then tune to frequency 162.450.

**Tune into an available radio station. Local stations include:**

~ **WUSF 89.7 FM** (Public Radio) ~ **WMNF 88.5 FM** (Community Radio) ~ **WFLA 970 AM** (News)

### To Ask a Question During an Emergency

Opens during emergencies. Hours vary and will be announced via the website, Ready Pinellas, and social media.
