June is here and that can mean only one thing! HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS...Please check now at the EXTERIOR of your unit and SECURE any LOOSE ITEMS, Gutters, Downspouts, or Ornaments, which could go air-borne in high winds. In this season, BE SURE TO KEEP PATIO UMBRELLAS CLOSED AT ALL TIMES WHEN NOT IN USE.

SNOWBIRDS: if you have left behind any LOOSE ITEMS that could "take off" in the high winds of a tropical storm or hurricane, reach out to your designated caretaker to SECURE or REMOVE them. Make sure that car and golf cart covers are fully secured.

Emergency Weather Radios

- Get automatic alerts from the National Weather Service (NWS).
- Configure radio to receive Pinellas County alerts only by using the Specific Area Message Encoding (SAME). **The SAME code for Pinellas County is 012103.**
- If the radio does not require a SAME, then tune to frequency 162.450.

Tune into an available radio station. Local stations include:

SRI TRUCK - Back in Service!

Repairs were recently completed, and the truck is available for resident use according to the Truck Use Policy. The policy is included in this issue.

IRRIGATION SYSTEMS...

- -Regular Maintenance by OWNERS is necessary to ensure systems are running at their best.
- -This means FREQUENTLY CHECKING sprinkler HEADS, sprinkler FILTERS, and around the "doughnut," and then <u>CLEANING</u> as needed.
- -Be sure YOU- or YOUR DESIGNATED **CARETAKER** if you're a Snowbird are keeping up with this regular maintenance.
- -The Responsibility for maintaining your sprinkler system does not stop during your time away. Check-in frequently with your designated sprinkler caretaker.

Snail Mail

If you MAIL your monthly payment, OR your bank MAILS a check on your behalf...

The USPS has advised of significant DELAYS at their distribution centers. This causes major hold-ups with the Mail being delivered to the lockbox locations (where your payments get mailed). South State bank's lockbox teams process the mail as soon as it is received but it is recommended to send mailed payments EARLY to allow for the extra handling and processing time via USPS. **REMEMBER: The grace period of no LATE FEES ended in MAY.** Payments received after the 5th day of the month are considered LATE and the \$25 delinquent fee and interest will apply.

EASIEST PAYMENT OPTION? Autopay! No more coupons, no more envelopes, no more stamps, NO MORE DELAYS, NO LATE FEE! The Autopay Authorization Form is in this issue and available on our website and at the Office. Just complete the form and submit it to the STONEHEDGE OFFICE.

Dress Code Required ®

Remember ... and be sure to tell your Guests and Visitors too ... that Stonehedge has a Rule that requires a dress code when residents or guests are not on a homeowners' premises. **This includes footwear, beach robes, or shirts over shorts or bathing suits. No bare tops**.

Long Range Planning

The POOL RESURFACE PROJECT is tentatively slated to start early to mid-JANUARY 2025 and to last for at least four weeks. In addition to the pool resurface the pavers on the pool deck will be cleaned and sealed. We do not have a definite start date at this time but will keep you posted. Please keep this project in mind as you make your January/February 2025 plans.

STREET PARKING...

Recently there seems to have been an increase in street parking and with it a surge in resident concerns. After all, we do have the narrowest of streets conceived in the days well before SUVs, Pick-Ups, Vans, and multiple vehicles per household were the norm.

While there are currently no SRI rules prohibiting or limiting street parking, it does seem RESPONSIBLE for us to do everything possible to make parking on the street SAFE and UNOBSTRUCTIVE. So, in that spirit, consider these suggestions if you park a vehicle on the street in the Park, especially overnight:

- -Park in the <u>direction of THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC</u> on that side of the road.
- -Stay a safe distance <u>AWAY FROM intersections & driveways</u> so you don't block others' visibility or access.
- **-DO NOT PARK NEAR THE NORTH GATES.** From the north side of Druid to the Gates, both sides of the street should remain clear.
- -If there are vehicles parked on the opposite side of the street from where you want to park, leave enough room for traffic to flow easily around both vehicles. Even better: Park on the <u>SAME SIDE</u> as the other parked vehicle. (This might be especially helpful on Azalea and Skyline.)
- -If you must park one of your vehicles on the street, consider parking the smaller one (lower profile) on the street.
- -Be aware that a street-parked vehicle can be AT RISK OF DAMAGE from Emergency Response Vehicles. FIRE TRUCKS must have access.



TALES FROM THE SOUTH PACIFIC

Greetings, Stonehedge!

French Polynesia belongs to France, the local currency the Pacific franc, and the capital Papeete in Tahiti. Seventy-five of the hundred and twenty-one islands are populated, habitation extending back two thousand years. The official languages are French and Tahitian. The economy is heavily subsidized by France so that people can afford to live here. One of these islands will be in the Parisian Summer Olympics, 2024, hosting the surfing competition!

Bora Bora, created by volcanoes, is dominated from all perspectives by a mountain peak soaring 2400 feet above sea level. The surrounding coral reefs are a surfer's paradise, a sea captain's and pilot's challenge!

Moorea is truly a tropical paradise! Magnificent jagged mountain peaks covered with jungle, stunning sunrises and sunsets, low built homes and hotel accommodation including tiki hut hotel bungalows built over the azure blue waters for honeymooners attracted to this beautiful place! The surrounding coral reefs create lagoons and surf for excellent fishing as well as for every imaginable water sport. A favorite port for many of the travellers! "South Pacific"!

Huahine, another mountainous island, composed of two islands, covered with lush green jungle, remains a beautiful peaceful reminder of old Polynesia. "Le truck", with its long hard wooden benches running the length of the open truck platform, took us over twisting winding bumpy roads to the capital town of Fare, located on the very picturesque coast. The tiny strip of stores and shops are a shopping and socializing destination for islanders. We wandered among the locals, listening to their languages, and enjoying their friendliness.

Papeete, Tahiti, is a bustling clean city spread

along the Pacific coastline with beautiful

mountains behind. Our taxi ride out of the city took us to a tall pretty mountain waterfall that tumbled down the volcanic rock through lush green jungle, to an area with lots of surfers enjoying the crashing waves, to beautiful magnificent panoramic views. The city is as busy as you would expect from a capital. The city market is a full block in size and two stories high. From the ship we watched the endless coming and going of ferries, military vessels, private yachts, as well as the steady stream of traffic on

the coastal street.

Fakarava is a boomerang shaped atoll (essentially a very flat island), sixty kilometers (about thirty-six miles) long and a few meters (yards) wide with a population of less then 900. Clean homes, churches, schools, shops, an airport, fishing, beautiful private boats all combine to look like pleasant idyllic living. The lagoon and the surrounding ocean contain coral, fish, and sharks. The sharks we saw close to shore appeared to be not bothered by the swimmers and snorkelers, and vice versa. 40's C/90's or more F with high humidity was the challenging weather for the day!

Nuku Hiva is another French Polynesian island of volcanic origin. Its many high peaks are covered with lush vegetation amongst which can be seen several homes built on the hillsides. Following a welcome at the shore by singers, dancers, and drummers, most of them with meaningful tattoos, we wandered the shoreline. Along the beach were stone tiki sculptures, a good sidewalk, attractive homes and shops, and lots of lovely tress and yards.

We hope you have enjoyed reading our stories about this amazing journey. Thank you for taking the time to share your time with us in this way! Happy Trails!



- NO SATURDAY or SUNDAY USE.
- 20 MILE MAXIMUM DISTANCE. (<u>Total to and back from destination</u>)
- Use is LIMITED TO 2 (TWO) HOURS.
- In accordance with FL Statute 316.305, no texting while operating (driving)
 the SRI Truck.
- Clean truck bed as may be needed BEFORE return.
- Time and Use Sheet must be filled out upon completion of use.
