GENEALOGY, GOING FORWARD

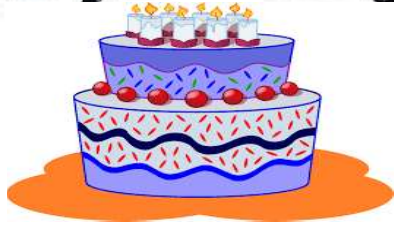
