Summer Office Hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00am to 2:00pm, with the copy room open from 8:00am to 4:00pm weekdays. Appointments are available to help accommodate your schedule.

The heat of summer is quickly approaching. We have plenty of sun, recently treated lawns for pests and gave a nice spring meal of both liquid and granulated fertilizers. All that is left is ensuring the irrigation is functioning properly. **Make sure you, or your caretaker, have your timer set for the right day and time.** Running your system twice a week and/or off schedule can create lower pressure in the assigned watering zones. Common areas in the community are scheduled around unit schedules. Running your system during those hours also lowers water pressure. Please contact the office or fill out a "Work Order Request" on the table outside the office door, if you need assistance setting up your timer.

Irrigation of established lawns and landscaping is authorized for **one day per week.**

Watering is limited to **the following hours** to minimize evaporative losses:

Prior to Leaving: Arrange with someone to ACTIVELY WEED & TRIM your garden flower beds, to CLEAN OUT YOUR GUTTERS of any collecting debris, and KEEP YOU INFORMED IF ANY OTHER MAINTENANCE ISSUES need attention.

Make sure the person/persons you choose has/have general operational knowledge of your *SPRINKLER SYSTEM* and conduct WEEKLY system checks to include:

1) Ensure proper time, date & zone watering schedule. City/County restrictions may apply.

2) Run the sprinkler system manually to ensure proper operation.

3) Clear ALL sprinkler heads of debris and overgrown grass for complete water coverage for the entire time you are away. All other sprinkler issues can be reported to management.
