Summer Office Hours are Monday through Friday, 8:00am to 2:00pm, with the copy room open from 8:00am to 4:00pm weekdays. Appointments are available to help accommodate your schedule.

The dog days of summer are upon us but the business of Stonehedge moves forward.

As most of you are aware, we are resealing the roads in our community over the next month. A **REVISED SCHEDULE** is included in this publication and will be posted on the bulletin boards. Color maps will be available online at

https://www.stonehedgeonthehill.org/ under the "Beacon" tab in the August edition.

Irrigation must be turned off 24 hours prior to and after sealing. Stonehedge personnel will be shutting down and turning on wells for scheduled sections. Some scheduled watering days will be missed due to this shutdown. You may experience shutdowns even when your street is not being paved, as there are multiple streets on each well.

Skyline will be closed at **7:30am**, **Monday**, **August 18** and reopen on Tuesday, August 19. The **East Portion of Parkview** will be closed at **7:30am**, **Monday**, **August 25**. This will result in **no curbside trash pick-up** for this section of the community. Trash can be brought to the clubhouse and deposited in the dumpster. If these closures do not affect your trash pick-up, we ask you not to bring your trash to the dumpster over the weekend. Please bag and leave curbside Monday in order to accommodate your neighbors need for disposal.

Recycling will be picked up on Thursdays unless your road is closed. Please hold your recycling for the next weekly pick up or bring it to the front of the clubhouse. Recycling can be held in a cardboard box so that you do not have to worry about retrieving your recycle bin after collection.

Please make sure your guests and/or tenants are aware of the road closures and waste disposal.

All vehicles need to be off the streets no later that 7am the day of sealing.


DO NOT MOVE BARRIERS OR CONES. DO NOT DRIVE ON PAVEMENT UNTIL ALL
