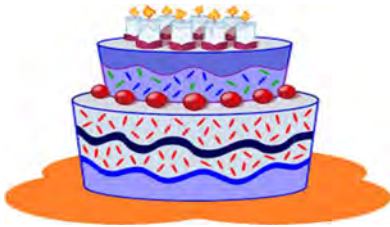
Beacon Distribution

2026 Monthly Maintenance Fees

Stonehedge Board of Directors has approved the 2026 Budget. The **monthly maintenance fee** will increase to **\$380.00 beginning January 1st**. If you are currently set up to have your monthly fees pulled directly from your account on the 3rd of each month (ACH), you will not need to do anything as it is automatically changed. If you have instructed your bank to send payment monthly (Bill Pay), you will need to contact your bank to make the necessary changes. If you pay by check or money order, you will receive your 2026 coupon book directly from the SRI bank. If you are not sure how you have been paying, please contact the office for assistance

Paperwork Confusion Breakdown

Are you confused which form to use for which purpose? Let's break it down.

If you are making a change to the exterior of your home, a **“Request to Make Additions or Changes Form”** must be submitted, and approved, before work can begin. Requests are approved at the Board Agenda and Monthly Board meetings. Requests must be submitted no later than Thursday to be reviewed by the next Wednesday meeting.



Want to paint your trim/house without changing colors? Need to replace sod? Changing out your windows with like items? The **“Notice of Planned Maintenance Form”** must be submitted to management for approval, before work can begin. Before and after pictures are required.

The **“Work Request Form”** should be submitted for all irrigation work needed. This form is to be turned in to management in order to schedule maintenance for the repairs.

If you find items in the common areas of the community that need attention, i.e. downed limb, street light outage, etc. there's a form for that. The **“Park General Work Order”** can be submitted for management/maintenance to address.

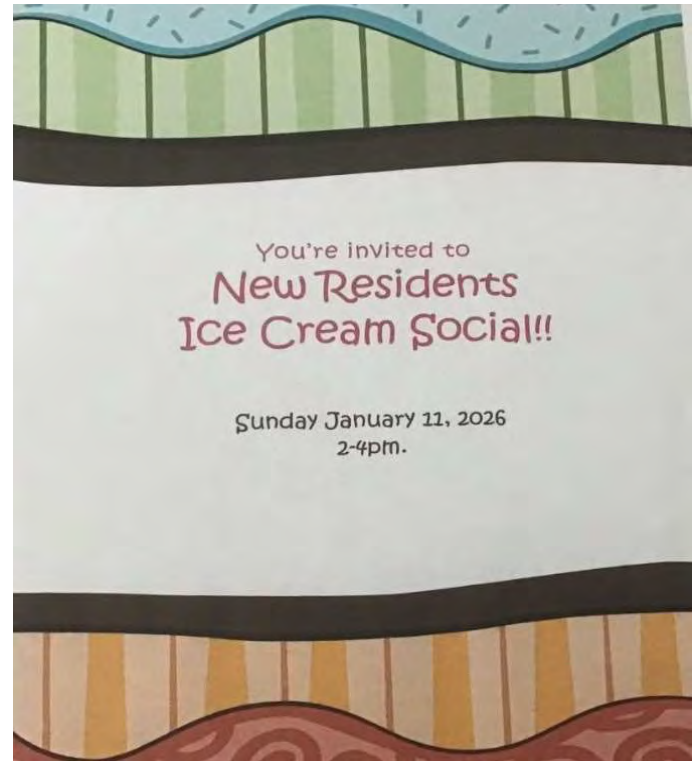
Refresh Your Security Practices for the New Year

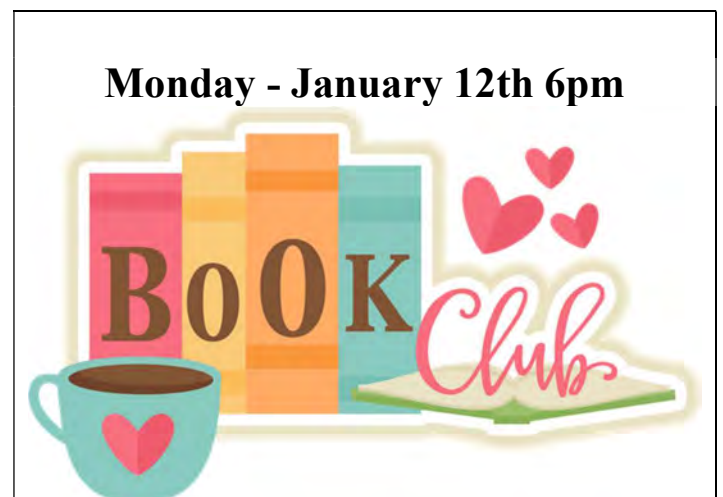
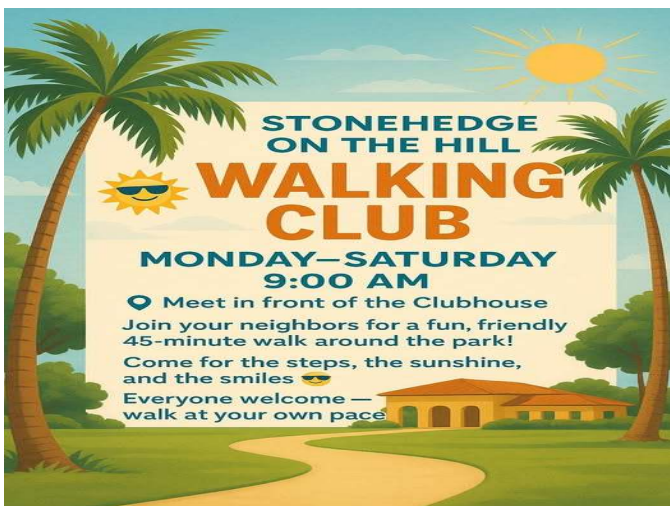
Home Computer Security Best Practices

- **Use Strong, Unique Passwords:**
Create distinct passwords for each account. Employ a reputable password manager (such as 1Password, LastPass, or Bitwarden) to generate and securely store complex credentials.
- **Identify and Avoid Phishing Attempts:**
Verify sender email addresses for authenticity. Hover over links to inspect their actual destinations before clicking. For urgent account requests, access the official website directly rather than using email links.

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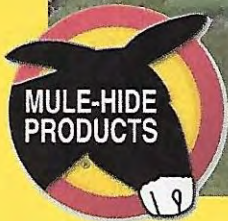


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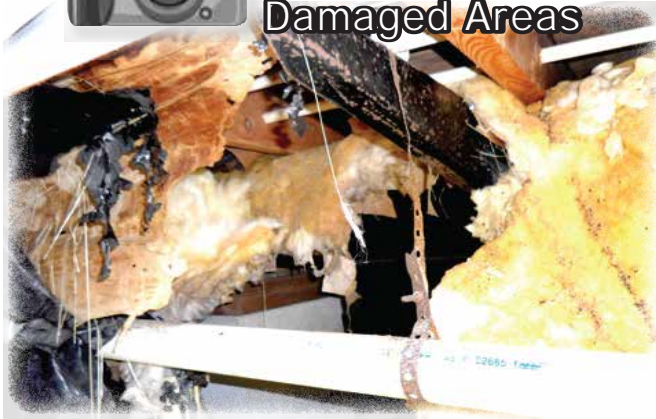
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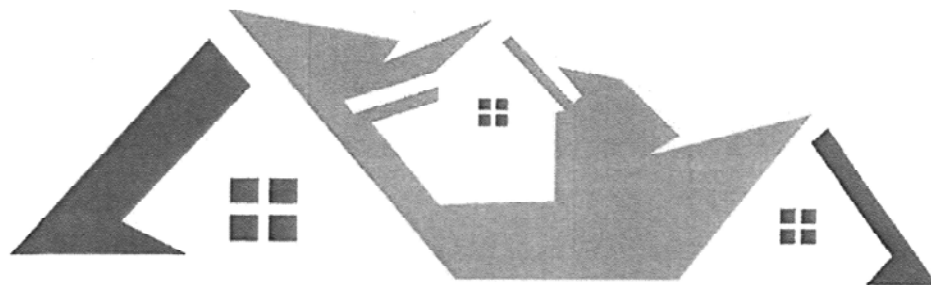
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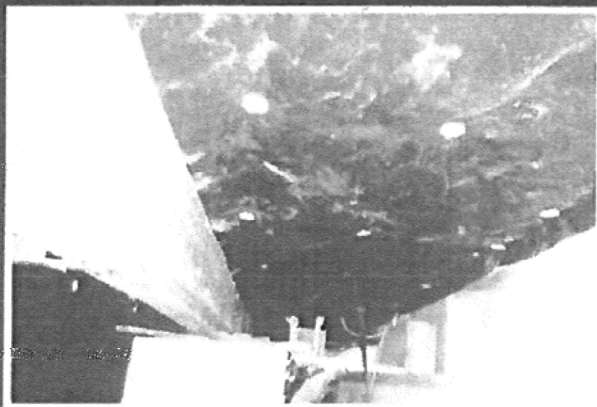
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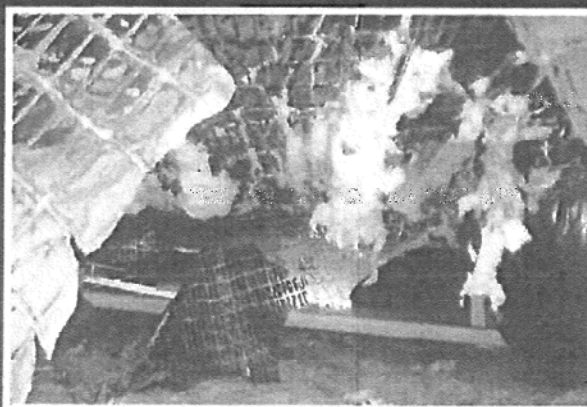
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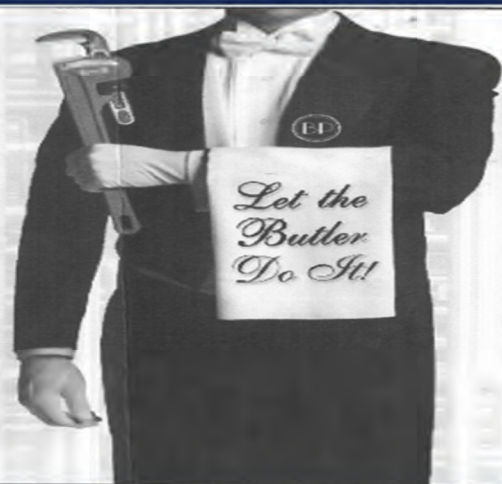
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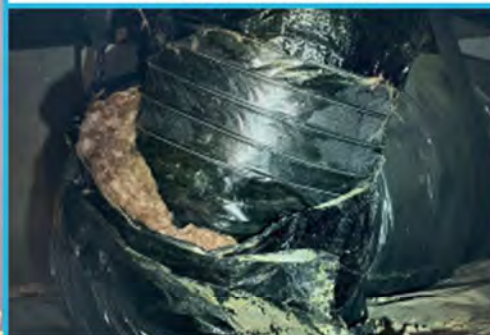
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Watering Restriction

District Declares Phase I Water Shortage

As of November 18, 2025, the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) has declared a Phase I Water Shortage due to dry conditions throughout the region. These restrictions are in effect December 1, 2025 through July 1, 2026.

The Phase I Water Shortage Order does not change allowable watering schedules, however it does prohibit "wasteful and unnecessary" water use, such as allowing water to flow from an unattended hose.

Watering with Potable, Well, Lake or Pond Water

Irrigation of established lawns and landscaping is authorized for one day per week. Watering is limited to the following hours to minimize losses from evaporation:

Morning Hours: 12:01am to 8:00am

Evening Hours: 6:00pm to 11:59pm

Watering is prohibited between the hours of 8 am and 6 pm.
